Ballinger Fixes Valuation on Tonnage Basis.

MILLION FOR UNCLE SAM

Remaining 80,000,000 Acres Classified and Sold Separate From Surface, Where Land Is Good for Farming.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—The United States Geological Survey is placing even greater emphasis this year upon its work of classifying and valuing the public coal lands. The National policy of promoting the most advantageous disposal of the public lands is continued under Secretary Hallinger and by his instructions the director of the survey is transmitting to the Commissioner of the General Land Office classifications based upon the reports of findings of the field geologists. The effort is to secure the wisest utilization of the resources of the public domain.

Recently enacted legislation gives to the agricultural entrymen whose entry was made prior to the passage of the act the privilege of electing to take the surface rights while the coal rights are reserved for future and separate disposition. In Colorado 90 per cent of the entrymen have taken this option. If the entrymen contest, the question is one of relative value for coal and agriculture. In the North Dakota lignite, the Government has decided in favor of the farmer.

Valued on Tonnage Basis.

The Secretary has fixed the price of coal land containing the lowest grade bituminous coal for lignites at the minimum provided by law, the intent being to encourage immediate utilization. Any special condition enhancing the value of the land for coal-mining purposes will be taken into consideration. The basis of valuation is now that of coal tonnage and the maximum land prices for anthracite and coking bituminous are raised from \$99 to \$99 per acre, and this maximum does not hold in "districts which contain large coal masses, where the character and extent of the coal deposits are well known to the purchaser." NEILL IN GEORGIA

AUTOS IN PLACE OF CARS

MOTHERS STORM SCHOOL

Become Panic Stricken When Fire Breaks Out—Pupils Calmed.

NEW YORK, May 25.—A panic-stricken mob of nearly 100 women, mothers and relatives of the 50 children who attend the large East 85th public school at Forsyth and Stanton streets, stormed the doors of the schoolhouse today when a fire started in a six-story tenement-house adjoining the school. The janitor quickly bolted the doors, and the teachers managed to quiet the children, who were kept inside. The fire was soon under control and no one was injured.
