

# FIVE BALLOONS LAND; SIX IN AIR

### Starters in National Long-Distance Race Move Southward.

## INDIANA CONTEST ENDED

Indianapolis Winner in 42 Hours, Half Record Time—Four in National Race Still in Air, Pensacola Is Limit.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., June 6.—Five of the nine balloons that started from this city Saturday in the National distance race of the Aero Club of America and the endurance race of the Aero Club of Indiana have landed.

These three landed today: The Chicago, with C. A. Coey and John Bennett, in the Indiana race, at Scottsville, Ky.; the Indianapolis, with Dr. Goethe Link and R. J. Irvine, in the Indiana race, at Westmoreland, Tenn.; the University of St. Louis, with John Berry and John McCullough, at Blanche, Tenn.

### Indiana Race Ended.

These balloons landed last night: The Ohio, with Dr. H. W. Thompson and J. Blake, in the Indiana race, at Nashville, Ind.; the Cleveland, with H. Morgan and J. H. Wade, in the National race, near Columbus, Ind.

All three of the balloons in the Indiana race have landed. Four of those in the National race are yet in the air, sailing in a general southerly direction.

It was reported the Indiana has been disqualified in the National race by descending to the earth for water and proceeding on its journey. A late message, however, from Pilot Fisher says:

### Message From the Indiana.

"Sumner County, Tennessee, June 6.—(5:10 P. M.)—Out of water. Am sending down two buckets. We have a slow southwest breeze, which we may hang to."

The Indiana endurance race was won by Dr. Link and R. J. Irvine, of the Indianapolis. They were in the air about 22 hours.

The Chicago was second and the Ohio third. The record is 44 hours, held by Alfred Le Blanc, of France, who started the Indianapolis race from St. Louis, Missouri, October 21, 1907, for the James Gordon Bennett cup. If the balloons still competing in the National race now on continental flight, they will have to land near Pensacola, 675 miles from Indianapolis, and therefore would have no chance of beating the record.

## AIRSHIP LINES ARE PLANNED

### Routes Will Be Followed From Paris in Many Directions.

PARIS, June 6.—The French Aerial League has perfected plans for lines of dirigible balloons from Paris respectively to Nancy, Lyons, Pau and Rouen. Five dirigibles will be employed in this service. Their length will be between 60 and 80 meters. Two will have a capacity of 500 cubic meters, one of 600 and two of 700 cubic meters. They will be capable of an average speed of 50 kilometers (31 miles) per hour.

The service stops will be made at Meaux and Rheims. Henry Deutsch de la Meurthe, who offered the prize of \$50,000 which Santos Dumont won by circumnavigating the globe in 1906, contributed a large sum to the enterprise.

### German Balloons Start.

BRUNNEN, Rhenish Prussia, June 6.—Thirteen German balloons started from here today on a long distance trial race. The three making the best records will take part in the race for the international cup in Switzerland in the fall.

## ADMITS KILLING RUHL

## NEGRO SIGNS CONFESSION AND PLEADS SELF-DEFENSE.

### Claude Edmonds, Manacled to Japanese, Is Jailed to Await Trial for Murder.

Claude Edmonds, a negro, under indictment by the grand jury of Multnomah County for murder in the first degree for killing L. Ruhl, the proprietor of a lodging-house at Seventh and Gilson streets, a year ago last December, arrived in this city last night in the custody of Detectives Craddock and Mallett from Redding, Cal., where he had been apprehended by local police officers on the description and circulars sent out by the Portland police. Edmonds confessed in writing to the detectives, in which he admits assaulting Ruhl, but in which he sets forth the plea of self-defense.

"I confessed to striking Ruhl with my gun," said Edmonds last night at midnight after his arrival at the Police Station. "Ruhl had accused me of being intimate with the Russell woman, and that led to a quarrel. He attacked me with a razor and to defend myself I had to knock him down with the butt of my gun. I was afraid of Ruhl, anyhow. He had attacked me with the razor before. He was jealous and thought I had interfered with his relations with the Russell woman."

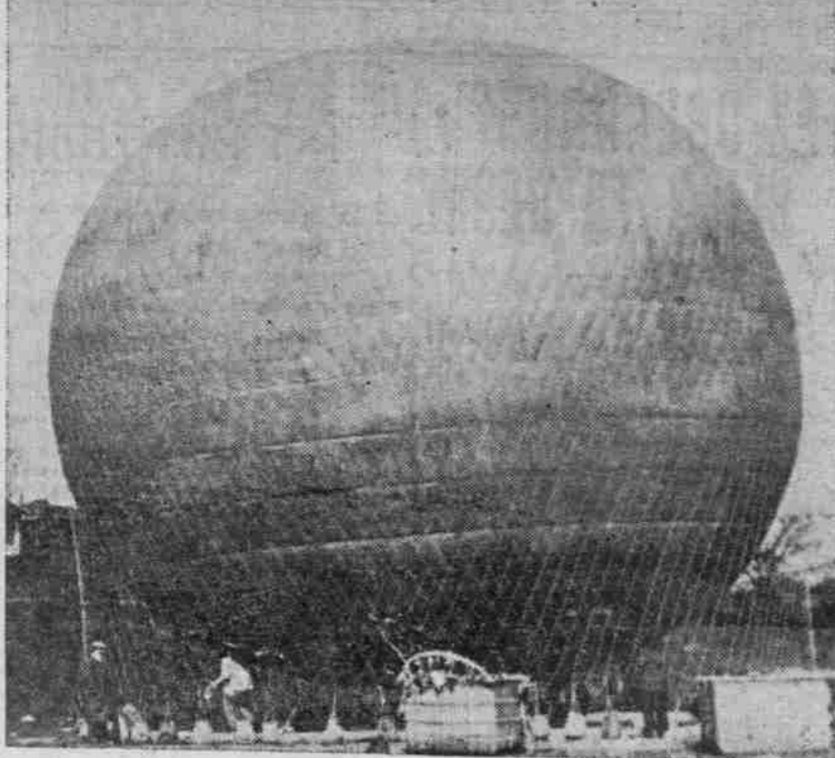
The police, however, maintain the theory that robbery was committed at the time, and have evidence, they say, which will undermine Edmonds' plea of self-defense and show that the Russell woman was known to have had a large sum of money about him just before the assault, and this money was missing when he was found unconscious.

Accompanying Edmonds was a Japanese, K. Nishi, who was taken into custody by the authorities in Sacramento, Cal., at the request of the Portland police on the charge of obtaining money under false pretenses. Nishi and the accused murderer were brought all the way to this city manacled together. Nishi is accused of passing a bad check on S. Han, a prominent Japanese merchant, who has a store at Third and Everett streets in this city.
