

USED BY PEOPLE CAUGHT IN THEFTS Organized Band of Boxcar Looters Brought to Light by Detective.

GENERATED FOR FIVE YEARS Obstacles Laid to Hobos Found to Have Been Committed by Railroad Employees, With Assistance From Residents.

ROSEBURG, Or., June 7.—(Special.)—Investigations which it is expected will bring to light the operations of an organized band of boxcar thieves have been conducted in this city some time ago by Southern Pacific Detective Reilly. The past five years the company has been compelled to pay shippers for the goods. The company laid the blame upon hobos, but it is now almost certain the goods were stolen by Southern Pacific employees. A brakeman named Yokum was arrested in action City Saturday and it is said confessed to the robbery with which he was charged and made a complete confession implicating 27 other local road employees. A quantity of the stolen plunder has been recovered by Detective Reilly.
