

PASSENGERS ALL AFTER DRIP IN SEA

Thrilling Experiences Told by Those Who Were Aboard Launch Rose.

ESCAPE OF ALL MARVELOUS

Little Vessel Badly Battered, but Engines Still in Good Condition. Captain Was Urged to Make Trip Into the Bay.

NEWPORT, Or., June 15.—(Special.)—Nearly every one of the 11 passengers on the launch Rose that nearly foundered in the surf in crossing the bar yesterday afternoon, is bruised, or nervous and ill as the result of the exciting experience.

From the stories told by the passengers it appears that three were washed overboard and that it was due to the heroism and coolness of H. G. Mape and Arthur Allen, two of the passengers, that any of them was saved.

Only one of the 11 passengers is disposed to place blame on the shoulders of Captain Johns who commanded the little craft.

Every precaution is taken. According to Captain Johns, Mr. Hampton was one of the passengers who insisted on crossing the bar.

"I would have preferred to remain out over night," said he, today, "but the passengers insisted on going in."

"The captain was repeatedly urged by the passengers to go in to take every precaution," said Mr. Mape.

"I was under the impression that Mr. Mape and I were to go in together. Somebody below me had a death ray on my leg. The boat turned clear over and I could see it above me."

The passengers who were on board the Rose were G. C. Mape, W. L. Mape, H. G. Mape, Miss Edna Mape, A. W. Peterson, Mrs. W. E. Peterson, and Captain Johns, engineer.

Mrs. Peterson was 20 feet under water and washed to the surface by the Rose, gives credit to H. G. Mape, who threw her a life line, for her rescue.

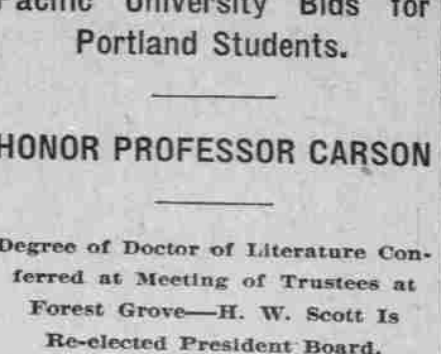
Mrs. Cochran was the widow of the late J. H. Cochran, former mayor of Oregon City. Judge J. B. Bowen were born to them, five of whom survive.
