LOS ANGELES, Cal., July 16.—Surrounding the variety of parade ever before seen in Southern California, the mid-summer flower and allegorical festival and parade of nations was viewed today by 300,000 spectators...

The inexhaustible floral wealth of the South was lavishly taxed to garland the hundreds of floats and equipages of all kinds that beautified the line.

More than 100 automobiles, lavishly decorated with flowers, greenery and flags, formed the division behind the grand marshal and his aids.

Two Score Floats. Floats to represent various fraternal organizations and various clubs and teams to the number of 40 were in the parade.

China paraded the gorgeous silken banners of that nation, its men marching in splendid costumes of silk and beaten gold and carrying implements of war and peace.

The great industrial division contained floats representing every industry and article of the Southwest. The float of Arizona, carrying a great kettle wrought of 3000 worth of pure copper, was greatly admired.

Old Stage Coach Seen. A feature of the procession was the old-time stagecoach in which Horace Greeley made his famous ride with Hank Monk.

Ten thousand Shasta Daisies formed the bulk of the miniature parade which floated on a sea of bluebell, the waves topped with pale green and crested with white blossoms.
