

JAPAN IS GROWINGLY THREATENS CHINA

Premier's Organ Says Terms Offered Unacceptable to Nippon.

PATIENCE IS EXHAUSTED

China Refuses to Reconsider and Japan May Abandon Effort to Conciliate — Alarmist Note Now in Controversy.

TOKIO, July 19.—The Kokumin, one of the most influential of Japanese newspapers and which is generally regarded as the mouthpiece of Marquis Katsura, the Premier, in matters pertaining to the government's policy, in an article today discussed the situation between Japan and China and strikes a somewhat alarmist note.

ITO RECEIVED WITH HONORS

Says Korea Will Not Oppose Extinction of Judicial System.

TOKIO, July 19.—Prince Ito, until recently the Japanese Resident General in Korea and regarded probably as the greatest of Japan's elder statesmen, returned from Seoul today and was received with unusual honors upon his arrival, by the express commands of the Emperor.

MAY MEAN RUSSIAN ALLIANCE

ONTARIO BRIDGE AUTHORIZED

Congress Passes Omnibus Bridge Bill, Caring for Many Places.

WASHINGTON, July 19.—The House of Representatives today passed the omnibus bridge bill, which authorizes the construction of Malheur County, Oregon, Canyon County, Idaho, and the Chamber of Commerce of Ontario, O., to construct, maintain and operate a bridge across Snake River at a point suitable to the interests of navigation at the town of Ontario.

TAFT WILL VISIT OREGON

WASHINGTON, July 19.—Representatives Hawley and Ellis called on the President today to ask him to stop at other points than Portland while in Oregon. The President said that on his way south from Portland he would stop at Salem, and if his schedule permitted he would try to make other stops. In case he goes to Denver, he told Congressmen Ellis he would endeavor to make short stops in Eastern Oregon.

CONGRESSMEN TO VISIT HAWAII

WASHINGTON, July 19.—A party of 23 Senators and members of the House is preparing to visit Hawaii. The visit is in response to an invitation extended by the Hawaiian Legislature at its last session, and the party will sail from San Francisco on the steamer Siberia, August 24. Eighteen days will be spent in Hawaii, during which the four largest islands of the group will be visited.

GRUBER CALLED WEST

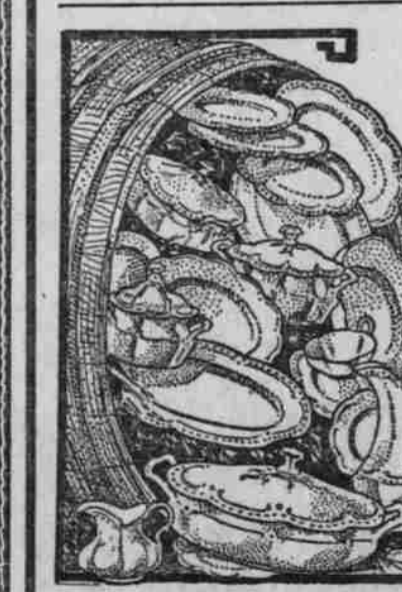
