



CEREAL FREIGHT RATES CUT

Oregon Short Line Schedule More

Favorable to Portland.

Material reductions in cereals and ce real preparations slipped by the carload from Portland to points on the Oregon Short Line in Oregon, Idaho and Utab. to take effect August 25, have been published the freight department of the O. R. & N. Co. These reductions amount in some cases to nearly 30 per cent, and have been made to assist Portland manufacturers in cereal products, and to increase their business in the territory tapped by the Oregon Short Line, as against manufac-turers on the Missouri River and the


