Frame Theaters Must Close by April, 1911, Says Board.

COUNCIL ASKED TO ACT

Period Originally Granted to Construct Brick or Concrete Buildings Is Cut Down Three Months by Resolution.

The City Executive Board yesterday afternoon adopted a resolution requesting the City Council to pass an ordinance prohibiting the use of frame theaters after April 1, 1911.

results, although it had been popularly supposed that the Council took the action desired by the Board. It was because of this fact that Mayor Simon asked the new Board to pass a similar resolution, with the date set as April 1, 1911, instead of July 1. This will now go to the Council, and it is understood that an ordinance such as desired will be passed.

The Executive Board directed City Auditor Barber to notify the United Railways Company to proceed at once with the laying of grove rail, such as are called for in its franchise, on Twelfth street, between Burnside and Thurman streets.

For the laying of asphalt on Hawthorne avenue, between East Forty-first and East Fifty-fifth streets, two bids were received. The Barber Asphalt Paving Company bid \$32,000, and the Cascade Construction Company bid \$22,000.

Owing to a mistake in figures, Contractor Steele was permitted to withdraw his bid for construction of the East Side police station, to be built at Hancock street and Union avenue.
