Shaky Condition of Wheat Market Checks Trading.

There was very little trading in the wheat market yesterday, either here or in the country. The sharp decline in the East and in Europe had the effect of making dealers hesitate and at the same time farmers offerings were not as free as they have been. Locally, wheat prices were quoted unchanged. Barley was quiet and trade in usts continued dull.
