

CARLISTS READY TO TAKE UP ARMS

Don Jaime Decides to Offer Nation 100,000 Men and His Own Services.

MOORS INCREASE ACTIVITY

Reports From Melilla Tell of Loss of 500 Men in Recent Skirmishes and Way Prisoners Are Tortured.

CERBERE, France, Aug. 6.—The Carlist leaders will hold a meeting shortly at a French frontier town to decide upon their attitude in view of recent events, it was said today.

The Carlists say that they are in a position to arm and place in the field quickly 100,000 soldiers burning with zeal.

Coupled with this announcement comes news that affairs at Barcelona are far from satisfactory.

It also is reported that prisoners held in the Moorish fortresses have been executed, and prominent revolutionists made the threat yesterday that if such news were taken another outbreak would follow.

RECENT SPANISH LOSS HEAVY Last Three Days Have Cost Invaders at Morocco 500 Men.

LIBRON, Aug. 6.—The Spanish Melilla correspondent says that the Spaniards have lost 500 men killed and 1200 wounded in the last three days of fighting with the Moorish tribesmen and that 25 officers and 150 men have fallen into the hands of the Moors, who tortured them before putting them to death.

Reports from Oran say that the Moors have seized the water supply of Melilla, and have succeeded in cutting off the flow of fresh water to the city, thus making an epidemic and water famine likely, and further embarrassing the Spanish forces.

MOORS MAKE NEW ADVANCES Grow More Active Against Spanish Outposts at Melilla.

MADRID, Aug. 6.—Official dispatches received today from Melilla say that the Moors in increased numbers again attacked the advanced posts of the Spaniards and that one soldier was wounded.

TOWN PUTS ON CITY AIRS

Clatskanie Proposes Cows Hereafter Shall Not Run at Large.

CLATSKANIE, Or., Aug. 6.—(Special.)—At a meeting of the town council yesterday rapid strides were taken toward making Clatskanie a progressive little city in the possession of an anti-cow ordinance, ordering a bill made nearly a quarter of a mile in length to open up Water street, provided for dredging the Clatskanie river for nearly one mile, and ordered a survey made to provide for a new and larger water system.

WILL END ALL DISPUTES

JAPS PAY TAXES TO CZAR

HARBIN, Manchuria, Aug. 6.—The Japanese living in the Manchurian railway zone, where Russia recently gave notice of the reimposition of taxes, have tendered payment of the taxes to the Russians, in acknowledgment of Russian sovereignty in that district.
