PREFERRED ALSO CLIMBS

Interest in the Market Centers in These Issues-General List Turns Weak and Closes

NEW TORK, Aug. 13.—Operators in the stock market today concerned themselves almost wholly with Union Pacific affairs. rumors did not tack vigorous support as shown by the day's advance to 215 for the common stock to 118 for the preferred stock. The special prominence of the pre-terred stock was due to the stories of new claims discovered for that stock to partici-pate in any plan for sharing the benefit of the company's investments, such as is pointed to by the reports that have been prevalent for the last few days.

The appointment of a committee to con-

sider a plan for segregating the investment holdings of the stock of other companies was made two years ago with an intimawas made two years ago with an intima-tion that it would be taken up when con-ditions became settled after the panic suf-nciently to make it feasible. A revival of the discussion, of the plan began when the rise in the price of Union Pacific had ex-panded it to a figure unwieldy for purposes of ordinary stock market activity.
