BAD MEN STILL SILENT

PROWLERS FIRED AT BY PATROLMAN SILENT IN CELLS.

Police Certain Prisoners Are Hardened Criminals—Third Degree Fails to Weaken Them.

Edward Rogers and Walter Brunman, the night prowlers who were targets for the fusillade of shots fired by Patrolman Swennes early yesterday morning on Kings Heights, continue to remain silent in their cells at the Police Station. Although subjected to strenuous questioning in the sweatbox yesterday by Chief of Police Cox and Captain of Detectives Baty, they steadfastly refused to throw any light on their antecedents. Neither would they divulge the purpose of their suspicious actions at the scene of the shooting or the name and possible whereabouts of their companion. He is still at large, and is thought to have found refuge to nurse a wound inflicted by the policeman's last shot at the fugitives. Both men are desperate-looking, and in support of the theory maintained by the police that they are hardened criminals, a number of telltale articles were found upon them immediately after their arrest. Several rifles, as carried by safe-crackers, and an oddly-designed handkerchief were taken from them. The police are satisfied beyond a doubt that the prisoners are criminals. The unsuccessful attempt to crack the safe in the Doernbecher factory Tuesday night, and the daring holdup of Saloonkeeper Lutkenmeyer, on Union avenue, Wednesday night, are attributed to professional-ists of the type of the two prisoners nabbed yesterday. The police have thrown a dragnet over the city, and wholesale arrests of suspicious characters will follow.

TRADE OF VOTES URGED

Philadelphia Wants Help From Portland on River Question.

That the congressional delegations of Oregon and Pennsylvania should "trade" in the matter of securing appropriations for the deepening of the channels of the Columbia and Willamette and the Delaware rivers, respectively, will be urged by Congressman J. Hampton Moore, of Philadelphia, now in Portland, at 11:15 o'clock this afternoon in the green room of the Commercial Club. The Delaware River runs through Philadelphia and empties into the Atlantic. The situation of that city, he declares, with reference to water transportation, is very similar to Portland.

Congressman Moore is an expert on waterways and, realizing the similarity of the local situation with that of his own city, has come here to interest Portland business men in a plan which contemplates mutual assistance in the matter. He will be entertained at luncheon informally today, following which he will deliver the address. Harriman Purchasing Director Here W. V. S. AGED WOMAN IS SAVED

Taken From Burning Home in Dead of Night With Difficulty.

As the result of a fire which originated in the home of Mrs. M. J. O'Neil, 750 East Forty-first street early Friday morning, several lives were jeopardized, a loss estimated at \$10,000 sustained and several homes in the neighborhood endangered. Owing to the lack of fire protection, the firemen were compelled to resort to the use of wet blankets in beating the flames into submission. The home of Mrs. O'Neil was totally destroyed with a loss estimated at \$5000 and but \$3400 insurance. The home of John Strahl, upon the next lot, was damaged to the extent of \$4500, partially covered by insurance. The residence of A. J. Parrington, 759 East Forty-first street, was scorched to the extent of \$200. The fire was discovered in the kitchen of the O'Neil home shortly after 2 o'clock A. M. by one of the household who was awakened by the smell of smoke. It was with the utmost difficulty that Mrs. O'Neil, an elderly lady afflicted with deafness, was aroused and carried from the burning building. Neighbors sent in telephone alarm to fire headquarters, and engine company No. 5 was sent to the scene.
