

DICKERSON FOUND GUILTY BY JURY

Compromise Verdict of Man-slaughter Is Reached in Murder Case.

REPORTS AT 10 O'CLOCK

Judge Gantenbein Announces That Sentence Will Be Passed Saturday on Man Who Killed H. A. Garrett.

Story of the shooting.

Garrett was in Dickerson's employ as a teamster at the time he was shot. The murder took place on the Dickerson ranch on the Patton road. Dickerson's wife had left him May 22, and he believed Garrett to have been responsible for her leaving. It was their second separation, a remarriage having taken place in the February previous, after Mrs. Dickerson had secured a divorce.

"I knew a man once who was so full of water that all he had to do was to stoop over and it would run out," said Deputy Fitzgerald. "I think my friend Fouts is in that condition, for in every case I have ever seen him try he has shed tears that way."

Shot in Broad Daylight.

"They ought to be ashamed of themselves, for they even went to the extent, after they had killed this poor fellow Garrett, of damning him, of telling you gentlemen, that they believe his soul is now in hell. That's a great way to defend a murder case. Even a man like this fellow Dickerson, with the blood of his fellowman on his hands, I would not like to see in the lower regions.
