

GATHER AROUND LIBERTY'S CRADLE

Descendants of Patriots Celebrate Anniversary of Yorktown.

VILLAGE STILL AS OF OLD

With Less Than 100 Inhabitants, It Swarms With Troops and Horsemen, Who Parade With New Generation of Town.

YORKTOWN, Va., Oct. 19.—Quaint old Yorktown, for the second time within the period of its national fame, today commemorated with fitting ceremonies that glorious event in American history with which its name is identified. Here was laid 128 years ago to a day the cornerstone of liberty upon which a great nation has been built, by the capture of Cornwallis.

Led by Signers' Descendants.

The descendants of the signers of the Declaration of Independence and an offspring of that organization, the Yorktown Historical Society of the United States, recently decided to hold an annual celebration here, and probably 500 people responded to their first appeal. When the fact that Yorktown is still without railroad communication is taken into consideration, the attendance was remarkable.

Parade of Horsemen and Children.

To most people the exercises were the least of the celebration, although there was a parade of mounted horsemen and footmen, led by the Fort Mifflin garrison and the soldiers and sailors, then a parade of the school children and afterwards public speaking from a grandstand erected in front of the historic old Nelson mansion.

One of Martyrs to Liberty.

Professor Ferrer, it is declared, will take rank with all those who have done the greatest service for humanity.

Declaring that though Ferrer suffered the ultimate penalty of a shameful death at the hands of those who rule in the doctrine of the "divine right of kings," the resolutions express the belief that the sacrifice was not in vain.

In its preamble to the resolutions, the council says the execution of Professor Ferrer has aroused the strongest indignation of all just, liberty-loving and broad-minded men of the civilized world.

Fight for Free Speech.

Among the other matters considered was a brief resume by President Gompers on his observations regarding labor conditions abroad. A telegram was received from the third annual convention of the West Virginia Federation of Labor, now in session in Charleston, expressing the hope that the efforts of the federation in behalf of the preservation of the right of free speech and free press may be crowned with success.

organic act of Hawaii.
