

OLD MAN FIRE'S VICTIM

CHESTER B. RHOADES ROASTED IN ROADHOUSE BLAZE.

Edward R. Rice, Proprietor of Macadam Road Resort, Nearly Loses His Life. Fire of unknown origin, which de-

Fire of unknown origin, which de-atroyed the Blarney Castle, a road-house conducted by Edward R. Rice, at 1435 Macadam road, at 2:15 o'clock yesterday morning, burned to death Chester B. Rhoades, 63 years old, who was employed about the place as a cook and general worker. The charred remains of his body were taken out of the ruins several hours later, and re-moved to the morgue by Deputy Coro-ner Dunning. Rice, the proprietor of the place, had a narrow escape from

moved to the morgue by Deputy Coroner Dunning. Rics, the proprietor of
the place, had a narrow escape from
death, and was forced to climb out
over the roof to safety. The hullding
was burned to the ground, and the loss
is estimated at about \$2,090.

Had it not been for Henry Schaffer,
the next-door neighbor of Rics, the
roadhouse proprietor might also have
lost his life in the seething flames, for
it was through Schaffer's frantic efforts
that Rice was awakened just before that Rico was awakened just before the flames, which had originated in the lower part of the house, enveloped the second floor, where Rice siept. Rice and the old man Rhoades were the only and the old man Rhoades were the only two people in the house, which is a two-story frame building with a small addition built at the rear, and connected with the main building by a stairway. The bedroom of the old man was located in this addition.

The fire was seen by Patrolman Maddux, and because the fire-alarm box was several blocks away, precious time was lost while he ran to turn in the alarm. The firemen responded prompt-

was lost while he ran to turn in the alarm. The firemen responded promptly, and members of Engine Company 10, who were the first to reach the scene, made futile efforts to get near that part of the house where the roasting body of the old man was known to be. Schaffer told the firemen he had heard Rhoades acream twice, after

which slience ensued, broken only by the crackling of the flames.

The aged wictim of the catastrophe was a veteran of the Civil War, having served as a private in Company E of the Ohio Volunteer Artillery. He has a son-in-law, J. B. Hessinger, living at Stewart's station, on the Mount Scott line. He was a native of Columbus, O., and had lived in Portland for many years. His funeral will take place today from the undertaking parlors of Dunning, McEntee & Gilbaugh, and the remains will be interred in Greenwood remains will be interred in Greenwood Cemetery.

Professor John Straub, head of the de-

partment of Greek and Latin and one of the ploneer faculty members at the uni-versity, is heading the movement to re-name the field after Judge McArthur.
