OLD MAN FIRE'S VICTIM

CHESTER B. RHOADES ROASTED IN ROADHOUSE BLAZE.

Edward R. Rice, Proprietor of Macadam Road Resort, Nearly Loses His Life.

Fire of unknown origin, which destroyed the Blarney Castle, a roadhouse conducted by Edward R. Rice, at 1415 Macadam road, at 2:15 o'clock yesterday morning, burned to death Chester B. Rhoades, 43 years old, who was employed about the place as a cook and general worker. The charred remains of his body were taken out of the ruins several hours later, and removed to the morgue by Deputy Coroner Dunning. Rice, the proprietor of the place, had a narrow escape from death, and was forced to climb out over the roof to safety. The burning was limited to the ground, and the loss is estimated at about \$2,000.

Had it not been for Henry Schaffer, the next-door neighbor of Rice, the roadhouse proprietor might also have lost his life in the seething flames, for it was through Schaffer's frantic efforts that Rice was awakened just before the flames, which had originated in the lower part of the house, enveloped the second floor, where Rice slept. Rice and the old man Rhoades were the only two people in the house, which is a two-story frame building with a small addition built at the rear, and connected with the main building by a stairway. The bedroom of the old man was located in this addition.

The fire was seen by Patrolman Maddux, and because the fire-alarm box was several blocks away, precious time was lost while he ran to turn in the alarm. The firemen responded promptly, and members of Engine Company 18, who were the first to reach the scene, made futile efforts to get near that part of the house where the roasting body of the old man was known to be. Schaffer told the firemen he had heard Rhoades scream twice, after

HONOR DUE M'ARTHUR

ATHLETIC FIELD TO BE NAMED AFTER YOUNG MAN.

Professor John Straub Starts Movement at University Which Meets Popular Approval.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Oct. 22.—(Special.)—A movement has been started by prominent students and members of the faculty to change the name of Kincaid Field, the athletic grounds belonging to the university, to McArthur Field. Judge L. J. McArthur was for 24 years a regent of the university, while his son, C. N. McArthur, Speaker of the Oregon House of Representatives and private secretary to Governor Benson, has done so much for athletics here both as a student and member of the alumni, that it is felt the name should be perpetuated in some fitting monument.

The present Kincaid Field was bought three years ago from H. R. Kincaid, ex-Secretary of State, for \$5,000. It is claimed, however, that Mr. Kincaid was paid full value for the land, and is no benefactor of the university and therefore deserves no such honor as has been given him.

Professor John Straub, head of the department of Greek and Latin and one of the pioneer faculty members at the university, is heading the movement to re-name the field after Judge McArthur.
