

APPLE FAIR CLOSES

"Homecoming Day" Attracts Hundreds to Albany.

HAWLEY GIVES ADDRESS

Visitors Are Tendered Reception at Alco Club, Where Judge Hewitt Welcomes Guests and State Printer Dunlavy Talks.

ALBANY, Or., Oct. 29.—(Special.)—

With an enthusiastic welcome from a union of former residents of Albany, the third annual Albany Apple Fair closed tonight. Every train today brought former Albanyans back to their old home town to celebrate "Homecoming Day." Most of them came from Portland, though many other cities were represented. The visitors were tendered a big reception at the Alco Club this evening, and this was followed by a "Homecoming" programme at the First Christian Church.

Fruitgrowing Experts Lecture.

The final educational programme of the fair was presented this afternoon, with County Fruit Inspector E. W. Cooper presiding. Professor A. B. Cord, of the Oregon Agricultural College, spoke on "Sprays and Spraying," and H. M. Williamson, of Portland, secretary of the Oregon State Horticultural Society, talked on "The Supply and Demand for Apples."

No Exhibit for Spokane.

At a meeting of the executive committee this morning it was decided that it would be impossible to send the local exhibit to the National Apple Show at Spokane, as planned. Under the rules governing exhibits here all individual exhibitors, with the exception of the committee, have no voice in the committee, but the county exhibits remain the property of the growers furnishing the apples. The local committee members, while anxious to see the fair, are desirous of sending all of the exhibit which came into their possession to Spokane, but the men in charge of the exhibits at Spokane, who are all from the county, refused to send their apples for the reason that they had other plans for their use either in displays in their home counties or in Portland.

LANE COUNTY MUCH PLEASED

Success of County in Raising Apples Gratifies Growers.

EUGENE, Or., Oct. 29.—(Special.)—There is great satisfaction here among fruitgrowers and citizens generally over the success of the Albany Apple Fair by the Lane County exhibit. The victory is made the more satisfactory because of the excellent exhibits in competition from other counties. Many here think there are a number of growers here who have steadfastly urged the advantage of this section for fruit-raising. The success of Lane at the apple fair, together with the success at the Albany fair, has won for the county a reputation as a fruit-raising section. Lane would make fully as good a showing in a competitive year show.

PAWNS WATCH, ARRESTED

Soldier, Accused of Hold-up, Is Found With Stolen Goods.

VANCOUVER, Wash., Oct. 29.—(Special.)—While attempting to pawn a silver key-ring and a watch at a pawnshop on Main street today, Albert Williams, private in a Battery, Fourth Field Artillery, in Vancouver Barracks, was arrested by Officer Ira O'Brien, holding up with a knife Edward Nerton, son of Robert Nerton, of Orchard. Nerton this morning reported to the police that he went to the pawnshop with the soldier to get a pair of rubber boots, and that while he was with him near the quarters the soldier held him up with a knife and took from him \$20 in cash, a silver watch, black purse, a Chinese coin and beer check on the United States Bank. All but the money were found in Williams' pocket when arrested. He denied holding up Nerton, saying Nerton had given him the purse, money and coin. He had told the pawnbroker that he had bought the watch in Portland.

PRISONER SKILFUL LAWYER

Ex-Anarchist-Lecturer, Accused of Murder, Conducts Own Defense.

SEATTLE, Oct. 29.—Peter Miller, formerly an anarchist lecturer, on trial in the Criminal Court for robbing a house in this city last June, and who, the police say, carried the Hugh McMahony, a bartender, in this city last Fall, is acting as his own lawyer and displaying all the skill and learning of an experienced attorney. He is examining the witnesses closely. Miller, who pawned McMahony's jewelry in Spokane, maintains that he got the articles from two other men, and the police have no direct evidence whatever to connect him with the murder of McMahony. McMahony was strangled so skillfully and quickly that the jewelry had not been taken, the body would have been buried as that of a man who dropped dead of disease.
