

MARRIAGE HOLD-UP MAN IS DIVORCED

Wife of Louis B. Reed Is Given Decree and Monetary Settlement.

AWARDED CUSTODY OF SON

Parents of Both Are Wealthy Oskosh, Wis., People—Defendant Is Lawyer Who Was Fined for Holding Up Friend as Joke.

Louis B. Reed, an attorney employed in the office of Gittner & Sewall, who was fined \$200 in the Municipal Court Monday for having held up a man named Powers on Portland Heights as a joke, was divorced by Circuit Judge Gatens yesterday afternoon. The decree was given to his wife, Madge E. Reed, daughter of A. E. Thompson, a wealthy attorney, of Oskosh, Wis. Both parties to the divorce suit come of wealthy parentage, Reed's father being a rich judge in Ripon, Wis. Reed was formerly a professional bicyclist in the East. But after his marriage he was admitted to the law firm of Thompson, Pinkerton & Jackson in Oskosh, with the understanding that he was to receive 10 per cent of the profits. He was married June 29, 1902.

Mrs. Reed testified yesterday that she left her husband because of his gambling habits and his unkindness, which later grew into accusations of unfaithfulness. "He said to me," testified Mrs. Reed, "that our baby looked like Ed. Dunbar, a man in middle life for whom we have much respect. My husband told me he could run me if he wanted to. 'A man has only to give the public a hint,' he said. 'At another time,'" continued Mrs. Reed, "I was at a dinner party a little longer than I had expected, and on my way home met an old friend who was cranking his automobile. He asked me if he could take me home, and I consented. When I reached home Mr. Reed was very much out of patience with me because I had allowed Mr. Cann to take me home, and insisted that I sit down and eat another meal with him, refusing to accept my explanations or to believe that what I was telling him was the truth. At another time—but he was not himself that night—he told me I could take my baby and go home just as quick as I wanted to."

Father Shows Reed Is Extravagant.

The depositions of several residents of Oskosh were submitted to Judge Gatens. Among them is the deposition of Judge I. E. Reed, father of the local attorney, who has been Municipal Judge in Ripon, Wis. for 25 years. His deposition shows that he has a son of 29 years at a wedding present, with the understanding that it was to be used in building a house for the young man and his wife. The newly married son and his wife, the depositor also had \$2000, said the older Reed, an inheritance from his uncle. But when he left Oskosh, after his wife had sold his son's house and his own, to Chicago, then to his uncle's in Burlington, Wash., then to Seattle and from there Alaska and later to Portland, Ore., said young Reed was \$1000 at a roulette game played at \$10 a throw in a room over his saloon. Harry C. Jenkins, a stenographer and friend of the younger Reed, said he went with Reed to a number of gambling-houses in Oskosh, while Charles Barber's deposition is to the effect that Reed has a \$15000 note for Reed as an accommodation because the young man had lost it gambling.

SEATTLE REPORT DENIED
