PLANS SENT TEN DAYS AGO

PENDLETON, Or., Oct. 31.—(Special.)—Congressman Ellis says he knows nothing of any new objections to the proposed site of the O. R. & N. bridge and does not know what action the Government will take in the matter.

"I will not say that we have interested Senator Bourne and Representative Ellis in our fight against the relocation of the O. R. & N. bridge," said Mr. Clarno, yesterday.

"From our investigation we have satisfied ourselves that the demand for relocating the bridge does not come from the O. R. & N. people, who have been given to understand, would be willing to replace the bridge used instead of building at another point nearly two blocks south.

CIVIC STUDY INDORSED

MILK FAMINE, FEAR

Dealers Say Rigid Rules Might Divert Supply.

OTHER COUNTIES SOURCE

Three Out of Four Creamer Men Assert Portland Must Depend on Dairies Located Outside of Multnomah.

Dealers in cream and milk almost unanimously agree with State Dairy and Food Commissioner Bailey that four-fifths of Portland's milk supply comes from unsuspected dairies in counties outside of Multnomah.

No Famine, Says Day. "We procure our supply of milk almost entirely from the Scappoose district, outside of the Columbia County line," said Mr. Day yesterday.

"The Portland Dairy Association obtains its milk almost wholly from the Fairview district and several of the other dairies in the city get their supply from dairymen in other sections of Multnomah County. I am satisfied that there is no danger of a milk famine, no matter how rigorously the inspection laws are enforced.

"There is no question but that a large proportion of Portland's milk supply comes from counties outside of Multnomah," said Arthur P. Bickford, manager of the Hazelwood Cream Company. "A rigid enforcement of the laws requiring the inspection of dairies is certain to drive this milk supply out of Portland. These non-resident dairymen are not compelled to ship their milk to this city. Much of the milk that is shipped into this county comes from Washington County, where there are two condensed milk plants, one of which, located at Hillsboro, only recently was compelled to close because of an inadequate supply of milk."

"We get the bulk of our milk from Washington County," continued Mr. Bickford, "and because of the efforts of the condensed milk plants to obtain greater quantities from the dairymen, we have had great difficulty in retaining our routes. In fact, it has been necessary for the last month to see that none of the dairymen supplying us were induced to transfer their entire output to one of these two plants."

"There is a disposition on the part of dairymen throughout the valley to give good service, and any attempt strictly to enforce the law against them will result in diverting this supply, on which Portland is so largely dependent, to other sections of the county. It is a matter of fact that the dairymen who are now engaged in retailing milk to Portland consumers."

The effect on the city's milk supply following an enforcement of the inspection laws depends entirely on the extent to which that law is enforced. I believe, however, that most dairymen will comply with the requirements of the law with the result that the city's supply of milk will not be reduced materially."
