French Shipowners Lose in Stevedoring Lease.

AFFECTS SEATTLE FIRM

Judge Donworth Decides That Cut in Price of Loading a Vessel Does Not Establish a Prevailing Rate for Labor on Ships.

McCabe & Hamilton, stevedores, of Seattle, Wash, have been awarded \$27.63 with interest from May 28, 1907, by Judge Donworth, of the United States Court. McCabe & Hamilton appeared as libel-ants in the case and the French bark Engenie Pautrel as respondent. The judg-ment was handed down yesterday and settles the matter of prevailing rates for

settles the matter of prevaining rates for stevedoring work.

Early in 1907 the French bark Eugenie Fautrel arrived at Seattle with a cargo of cement for Balfour, Guthrie & Co. She was also under charter to the same She was also under charter to the same firm for outward loading of wheat for the United Kingdom. Under the terms of the charter party Balfour, Guthrie & Co., were to supply stevedores at the rate prevailing at the time on Puget Sound. prevailing at the time on Pupet Sound. McCabe & Hamilton were handling that work for the exporters and the master of the French vessel was asked to sign a contract for 22½ cents a ton for the discharge of the cement and for 30 cents a ton for the loading of the wheat cargo. A rival stevedoring firm agreed to do the same work for 30 cents out and 25½ cents in with a rebate of 7½ per cent on both charges.

The captain refused to take the steve-The capitaln refused to take the steve-dores designated by Balfour-Guthrie & Co., and it was not until forced to it that he worked the ship with McCabe & Hamilton. When he settled he paid the bill on the basis of 30 cents and 27% cents, also deducting the 7% per cent. The matter was taken into the courts with the result that the stevedoring firm has been awarded the balance of the bill.

The Butterfly was burned while taking wood fuel at Martins Bluff. She was in command of Captain Al Brazee and at the time it was reported that the fire was caused by an explosion of oil. 
