Third Woman's Name Mentioned in Connection With Warriner Case.

#### MRS. STEWART THREATENS

Papers That Throw More Light on Theft of \$643,000 Are Said to Be Locked Up in Deposit Vaults.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 11 .- The mystery that surrounds the relations of Charles L. Warriner, defaulting local treasurer of the Big Four Railroad, to the two women and a man who he asserts have systematically blackmailed him for sevyears, was deepened late today, when it was learned from one of the railway officials that another woman, whose name had not been previously mentioned,

This official, who has been detailed to investigate the \$643,000 shortage, confessed by Warriner, said that the woman who enters as a new factor into the case had, as far as he knew, no criminal connection with the embezzlement, but could give important information. Her name has been given to Prosecutor Hunt and she will probably be summoned before the grand jury.

She reiterated that she never received a cent from Warriner.


