

FAIR ONES PLAYING PART IN BIG STEAL

Third Woman's Name Mentioned in Connection With Warriner Case.

MRS. STEWART THREATENS

Papers That Throw More Light on Theft of \$643,000 Are Said to Be Locked Up in Deposit Vaults.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 11.—The mystery that surrounds the relations of Charles L. Warriner, defaulting local treasurer of the Big Four Railroad, to the two women and a man who he asserts have systematically blackmailed him for several years, was deepened late today, when it was learned from one of the railway officials that another woman, whose name had not been previously mentioned, was involved.

This official, who has been detailed to investigate the \$643,000 shortage, confessed by Warriner, said that the woman who enters as a new factor into the case had, as far as he knew, no criminal connection with the embezzlement, but could give important information. Her name has been given to Prosecutor Hunt and she will probably be summoned before the grand jury.

Health Reported Broken.

Reports of Mr. Warriner's breakdown in health were reiterated today. Mrs. Jeannette Stewart promised interesting developments in the case today. Locked in a safety deposit box under her name, Mrs. Stewart declares she holds letters from the Chicago man who has been named as one of the blackmailers of Warriner. These, she declares, she will make public at the proper time.

"They've pressed me too hard," she stated, "and I have to defend myself. I hold these letters and when I make them public they'll make those around the Big Four offices sit up and take notice. Why don't they arrest me if they think I've taken blackmail money? These letters will tell why they don't arrest me."

Says She Is Scapgoat.

Mrs. Stewart declared that the others implicated in the case have agreed to throw all of the burden on her. "And I won't stand it," she added. "I've tried to keep out of this, but they won't let me. I only hope they let me go before the grand jury. If they don't I'll bring the whole business in court myself, for I'm determined to clear my name."

Mrs. Stewart called up Mrs. Charles Warriner. They had an extended conversation over the telephone. Mrs. Stewart said Mrs. Warriner admitted the conversation but declined to go into details. Mrs. Stewart admitted she had received money from the Chicago man mentioned as one of the Warriner blackmailers, but was not aware at the time that it was the fruit of blackmailing. She reiterated that she never received a cent from Warriner.

WIFE MURDER ADMITTED

Indianapolis Farmer Tells of Shooting Woman From Bridge.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 11.—Edward Hoff, a farmer, confessed to the police tonight that the body of the woman found in the river near here last Monday was that of his wife. Hoff admitted that he had caused her death by pushing her from the bridge of the Indiana Union Traction Company, which crosses the river at Broad Ripple, just beneath the city.

TYPHOON DESTROYS TOWNS

British Cavalry Officers Win Third Victory Over All Nations in Jumping Contest.

Lieutenants York and Sebag-Montefiore, riding abreast in uniform on government horses, were first over the obstacles.

COSTA RICA IS INVADED

Officials Complain That Zelaya Fights Nicaraguan Rebels.

PANAMA, Nov. 11.—Passengers from Central America confirm the report that the forces of President Zelaya of Costa Rica, have several times invaded Costa Rican territory in order to attack the Nicaraguan rebels.

The Government officials of Costa Rica, protested against these invasions, hurried troops to the frontier and appealed to the United States to intervene. President Zelaya fearing that Salvador is invading the Nicaraguan rebels, has armed 2000 disaffected Salvadorians to foment rebellion in Salvador.

HIGHER RATE RESTRAINED

Judge Enjoins Roads From Putting Up Tariff on Lemons.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 11.—On application of Joseph Call, attorney for the lemon-growers of Southern California, Judge W. W. Morrow, of the United States Circuit Court, issued a temporary restraining order late today forbidding the Southern Pacific, San Pedro, Salt Lake & Los Angeles and the Santa Fe railroads from raising the freight rate on lemon shipments from this state.

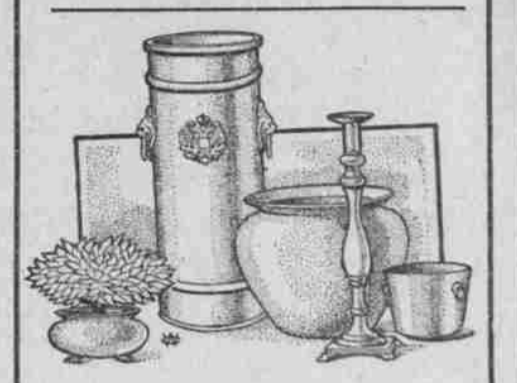
