

### KIDNAPING COUSIN, BOY SURRENDERS

#### Oregon Youth Walks Ten Miles and Gives Self Up to Sheriff.

### STABBING IS NOT FATAL

#### Winfield Huddleson, of Lebanon, Is Driven 14 Miles to Surgical Aid, That Flow of Blood Might Be Stopped to Save Victim.

ALBANY, Or., Nov. 21.—(Special.)—With the big curly hair and right arm severed by a knife in the hands of Merritt Jennings, his cousin, Winfield Huddleson, a 30-year-old Lebanon boy, was driven 14 miles to Albany early this morning for surgery. The boy was taken to the hospital at 8 o'clock this morning. The stab wound, which was 10 inches long and 1/2 inch wide, was inflicted on the right arm, inflicting a severe wound. The cut extends clear across the width of the arm on the inside of the elbow joint and extends downward to the bone all the way.

#### Youth May Aid Assailant.

It has not been determined what charge will be filed against Jennings, and this depends to some extent on his age. He claims he is only 18, but Newton Huddleson, his uncle, and the father of the wounded boy, says he is 18. The two boys involved in the affair have always lived close together and have never had any serious trouble until last night, although young Jennings asserts his older cousin has always looked on him. The first difficulty which led to the stabbing occurred shortly after midnight, when Jennings went to his cousin's home to get some bedding he had stored there. As it was late at night, and as Huddleson asserts, because Jennings was drunk, he refused to let him in the house and locked the door in his face. Jennings stood on the porch and kicked the door for some time and then went away.
