

PENNSY DEFEATS CORNELL IN MUD

Fully 20,000 People Brave Elements to Witness Slow Game.

FINAL SCORE IS 17 TO 6

Contestants for Eastern Football Honors Wallow Around on Field of Slush, Ice and Pools of Water.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 25.—Wallowing and sliding around on a field deep with mud, slush, ice and pools of water, the University of Pennsylvania football team defeated Cornell in the annual game on Franklin Field by 17 to 6.

It was a poorly played game, for which weather and field conditions were, in a great measure, responsible. Twenty thousand persons witnessed the game. There was hardly any choice between the two teams in the first half, which ended 6 to 6, but Pennsylvania showed the better form in the second half.

Cornell started out like a winner. The Ithacans kicked off. Pennsylvania failed to make any gains on the ice and pushed to midfield. A kicking tactic was returned by Cornell and, getting the ball on a fumble, the Ithacans started to hammer the Pennsylvania line. Robb made the touchdown and O'Connor kicked the goal.

Getting the ball in Cornell territory on a fumble, following the punt, Pennsylvania changed its kicking tactic and started to buck center. Cornell could not keep a solid footing and slowly was pushed back. With five yards to gain, the ball was given to Pennsylvania and he was pushed over for a touchdown.

Bradlock kicked goal. Pennsylvania broke the tie soon after the second half began. Five yards were made with difficulty, but Pennsylvania finally had the ball less than 10 yards from the Cornell goal line. Here Cornell held, but on the last down Pennsylvania kicked and he was pushed over for a touchdown.

SOAP CAKE SAVES LIFE

WAR VETERAN SHOOTS MAN WHO HAD HIS MONEY.

But for Cleansing Article Which Victim Carried Death Would Have Been Instant.

Unable to get the police interested in his case, Samuel Custis, 63 years old, a native of North Carolina and a Confederate veteran, took the law into his own hands last night and shot Albert Wilson.

Wilson's wounds are probably fatal. According to Custis, yesterday morning in the Central rooming-house, 14 North Second street, he went to the police headquarters to report the theft, while under the influence of liquor.

He was locked up on a drunk charge. Yesterday afternoon he was released and found Wilson last night in his room in the Central Hotel.

Custis described his purse and the denomination of the bills. The purse was later found under Wilson's pillow by Sergeant Goltz.

One of the bullets took effect in Wilson's stomach. Another entered his breast near the heart. Wilson had a cake of toilet soap in a shirt pocket over his heart. The bullet struck this. The cake was oval in shape and the ball struck it on the left side, causing it to slant outward, which probably saved him from instant death.
