PIPE WORKS TO BUILD ON PENINSULA.—The Glazed Cement Sewer Pipe Company has secured through George Heuser, of the Kenwood Land Company, a site in Kenton, and has let the contract for the erection of a factory building, 200x300. The building will be frame and one-story, and will be built at the junction of Derby street and Columbia boulevard, in Kenton. The company will employ between 50 and 60 men.
