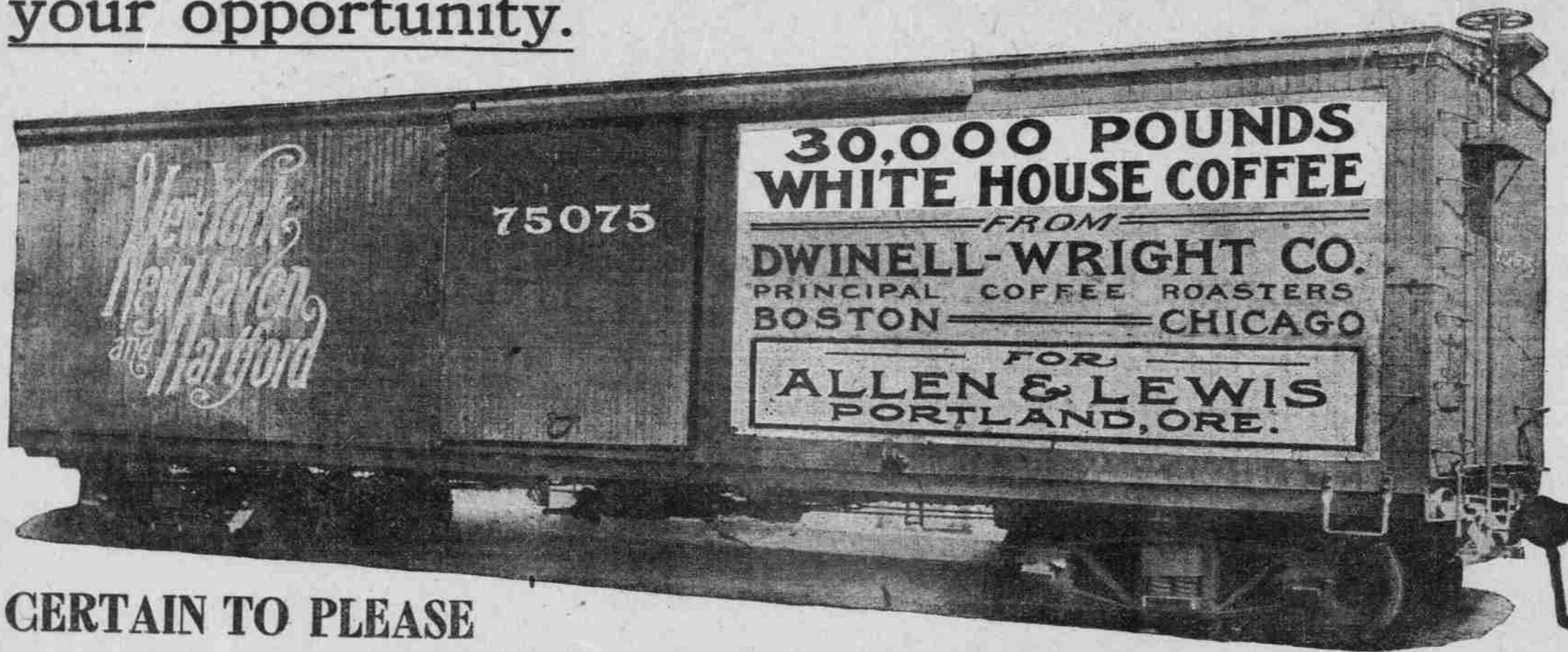

WIRELESS TALKS FAR

1000 MILES COVERED, BUT SEASICKNESS HURTS SIGNALING.

Government Thoroughly Investigates Equipment on Ships—Plan 3000-Mile Talk.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—Warranted to operate in all kinds of weather, over a distance of 3000 miles, the new wireless equipment on the scout cruisers Salem and Birmingham has been found unable to withstand the handicap of seasick operators. The two ships have returned to Hampton Roads from a test at sea in which they were 1000 miles from each other and 300 miles from the high-powered wireless station at Brant Rock, Mass. A fierce storm separated the ships at sea, and not only were conditions for wireless communication most unfavorable, but the tempestuous sea resulted in seasickness in nearly all quarters. Communication between the two ships and Brant Rock was obtained at 1000 miles, but there were serious interruptions. Naval officers do not consider that the test shows the apparatus to be a failure. In the next test, the ships will be stationed 3000 miles from Brant Rock. This will require one to be near Trinidad and the other 1000 miles out from the

WEDDING STORY HOAX

WARRANT OUT FOR YOUNG MAN WHO TOLD TALE.

Sympathizers With "J. C. Kirkland," Supposed Thaw Relative, Now Seek Borrowed Cash.

NELSON, E. C., Dec. 29.—A warrant has been issued for the arrest of "J. C. Kirkland," a young man who came to Portland among other stories, told of the tragic ending of the wedding arranged to take place here between his sister and Dr. Martin of Revelstoke, owing to the sudden death of his brother, John Thaw Kirkland, at Revelstoke. He said he was a relative of distinguished Scotch families and a nephew of Mrs. William Thaw, mother of Harry Thaw. He also stated that he had just come into a fortune. He arranged with Rev. Mr. Ferguson here for the wedding, induced him to make an announcement of the event in the newspapers, and afterward cancelled the arrangements on the plea of the death of Revelstoke. Acquaintances he formed here were so much impressed with his fortune and fringes that they entertained him lavishly and lent money to him. Kirkland, after getting all the money and favors possible, disappeared.

REPUBLICAN NEXT JUDGE

GOVERNOR BENSON SAYS WEBSTER HASN'T SPOKEN.

In Case County Magistrate Resigns Party Man Will Be Named, Says Executive. "I have not received the resignation of Judge Webster, of the Multnomah County Court, nor have I entered into any negotiations with the Judge, or any other person or persons, concerning the appointment of a successor to Mr. Webster, in case his resignation should be placed in my hands." Governor Frank W. Benson was most emphatic in making the foregoing declaration at his rooms in the Hotel Imperial last night. The Governor was just leaving for the Army to review the Oregon National Guard, but he took time to say his present visit to Portland was devoid of political interest. "Judge Webster recently came to Salem and was in consultation with the State Commissioner of Insurance concerning his engagement with a company which he has in view," said Governor Benson, "but the Judge did not come to see me, nor has he at any time demanded that I should agree to name a successor whom he should select in consideration of his resignation. "I do not know whom I should appoint if a vacancy should occur. I say frankly that the appointee would be a Republican, and if possible to bring about such a result he should be satisfactory to the Republican organization of this state and county. Please make that plain. I mean a Republican of established ability and known integrity will be named by me to fill the place in case Judge Webster should resign." The Governor left the hotel in company with Colonel McDonnell for the National Guard Armory.
