BRIDGE CONTESTION

Argument Today May Decide Fate of Broadway Project.

OBJECTION IS TECHNICAL

Demurrer to Kierman's Suit to Prevent Sale of Bonds to Be Heard by Three Judges of Circuit Court en Banc.

Arguments which may mean life or death to the Broadway bridge project in its present form will begin before three judges of the District Court en banc, this morning, and may continue over today and a large part of tomorrow.

Two suits will be heard by the court against the bridge project, one involving directly the right of the city to issue the proposed bonds covering its cost, and the other opposing the condemnation of land for one of the approaches to the bridge.

Technical Objection Offered. One of the chief arguments against the validity of the proceedings is that the people have no right to change the character by vote to permit the sale of the bonds, as that power, he holds, is vested only in the State Legislature.

According to the charter, a certain time must elapse after the beginning of a proceeding for the sale of bonds for a public utility before the election is held.
