Peru and Ecuador Expected to Patch Up Their Differences.

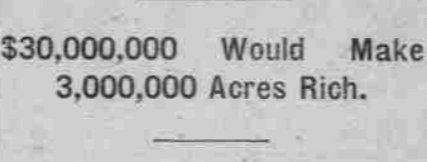
