

TUBERCULOSIS IS CARRIED BY EGGS

Barnyard Hens Offer New Source for Spreading Great "White Plague."

W. H. LYLE MAKES REPORT

State Veterinarian Is Substantiated by Diagnosis of Dr. Mohler, of Federal Bureau—Germs Killed in Eggs Well Cooked.

Eggs laid by tubercular hens serve as a medium to spread tuberculosis, according to W. H. Lyle, state veterinarian, whose report has just been filed with Dr. Calvin White, secretary of the State Board of Health.

"Tuberculosis in fowls has been discovered in some four centers throughout the state. These birds in widely separated districts, both in the arid and humid sections of Oregon, are at a loss to account for the production of this disease, unless it be from a human or other animal source."

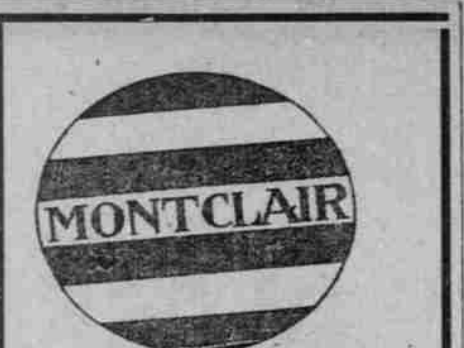

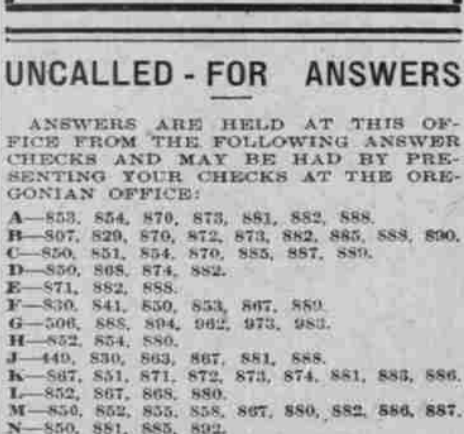
