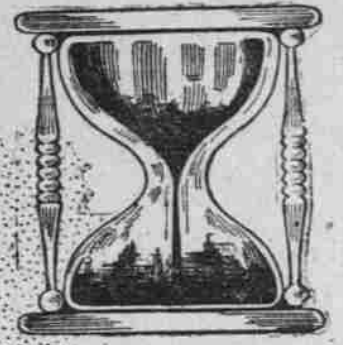

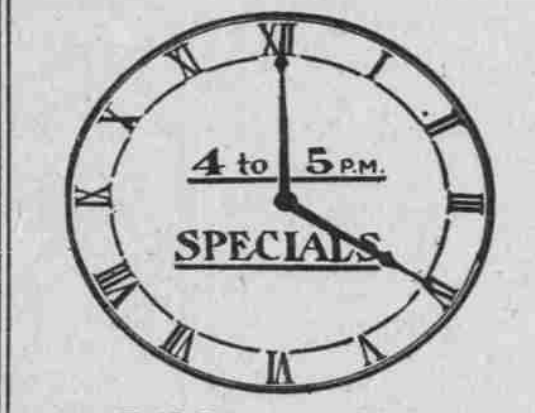

City Council Members Seek Ideas Here for Hard Surface Streets.
Members of the Kelso City Council were in Portland yesterday in the endeavor to select a reliable pavement for the 12 blocks it has been decided to hard-pave in the Washington town. No arrangement has been made but agents of the different companies entertained the visitors yesterday and it is expected the result of their investigations will be made known soon in Kelso.
Seven members of the Council and the president of the Commercial Club made

up the party, which arrived in Portland Monday night. At noon yesterday the party took lunch at the Commercial Club.
"We have a flourishing little town," said J. L. Harris, president of the Commercial Club, "and we want to do just the best possible with our paving. That was the reason we came to Portland. I have suggested to our people that they consult with City Engineer Morris, who is capable of giving advice on Portland streets."

FENDERS RESCUE DUMMIES
More Trials of Patent Devices for Streetcars Will Be Held.
Nothing definite resulted yesterday morning at the tests of fenders for streetcars supervised by Mayor Simon and Councilmen Bushlight and Ellis, at Twenty-sixth and Upshur streets. The Nelson automatic device, a new invention by Frank J. Kemp, and Leong Dan's fenders were tried out. Another trial will be had, it is thought, as the Kemp type worked fairly well and its advocates wish a further chance.
Nothing went wrong with the mechanism of the Nelson fender as on the two previous tests. F. A. Nelson, inventor, was well pleased with the results obtained. The device picked up the dummies each time.
E. J. Brady is interested in the Kemp device, and had charge of the demonstrations. The Kemp model is an automatic trip with a buffer for safety purposes to prevent striking the victim's head against the dashboard. The fender picked up the dummies well, but it was run low on the track and it was impossible to tell from actual work what it would do when raised to the 10-inch gauge, said to be necessary in Portland on account of the grades on some of the carlines.
Mayor Simon expressed considerable

interest in the Nelson fender, saying he thought it would work well in actual operation, as it did on the dummy tests. The Kemp fender will probably be tried out again within a week or so.

SUMMER SCHOOL EXPANDS
Y. M. C. A. Curriculum to Be Wider in Scope This Season.
Plans have been adopted by the Portland Young Men's Christian Association to conduct a Summer school this year.
