

JOHNSON BEGINS ACTUAL TRAINING

Champion Fighter Walks and Runs Seventeen Miles on His First Day.

BOXING HAS NOT STARTED

Legro Patiently Poses for Newspaper Photographers, and Writers Get Chance for Critical Surveys of Boxer's Bulk.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 9.—(Special.)—Twelve miles of road work in the morning and something like a five-mile jog late in the afternoon constituted the first day's training done in California by Jack Johnson for his coming fight with Jeffries.

In between, for about an hour, Johnson, as he had promised, posed patiently for the newspaper photographers and did not suggest quitting until the last one of the camera men said that he had enough.

Some Extra Weight Shown. Naturally there is some extra weight about the stomach, but not as much as was expected in view of the leisurely way in which Johnson has been enjoying himself.

Johnson Looks Well. If he sticks conscientiously to the programme of road work that he has set out for himself he will work down into condition by the time he is ready to box for the first time.

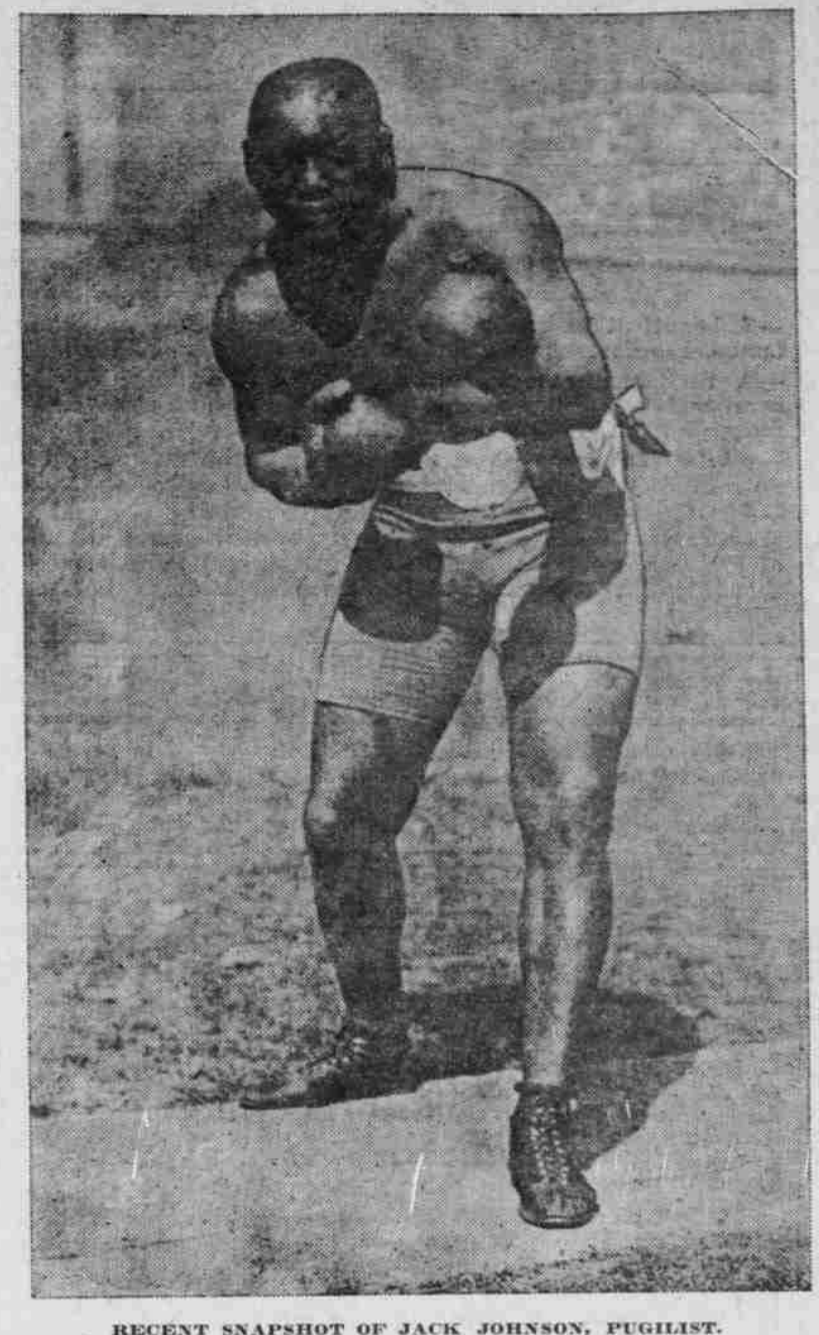
ANGELS DOWN SAN FRANCISCO. Golden Gate Team Uses Two Pitchers, but Cannot Prevent Defeat.
