LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 16.—(Special.)—It was a ragged game today, with four pitchers participating, two on each side. The Beavers won again, 8 to 4, thus putting another crimp in the Angels' ambitions.

In the first inning, after Ort fanned, Olson was safe when Roth furnished his hot-grounder to third. Hettling was out at first, McCredie walked, Fisher singled, scoring Olson. Ryan hit to Delmas, forcing Fisher at second.

In the third the Angels went to pieces and after Ort had fouled to Roth, Olson singled to left and took second when Murphy kicked the ball instead of catching it. Hettling singled to center, sending Olson to third, from where he scored when Daley tried to field the ball with his feet.

In the fourth Rapps walked. When Speas went after a high ball to sacrifice the ball slanted to the bat and struck him on the forehead, necessitating a delay to permit him to recover.

There was no more scoring until the eighth, when, for the Beavers, Rapps walked and Speas hit to Wheeler, who touched second, forcing Rapps. Speas stole to second and took third on Seaton's out at first.

Ort singled, scoring Speas and was out stealing second. Olson struck out in the ninth and Hettling walked and stole second. McCredie fouled to Delmas. Fisher doubled, scoring Hettling.
