How Council Vote Stood. Councilmen Annand, Belding, Cellars, Driscoll, Dunning, Menefee, Wallace and Watkins voted for, and Councilmen Cannon, Ellis, Kuhl and Lombard voted against the adoption of the resolution.

The resolution directs the City Attorney to draw up the legal documents necessary to the conclusion of the negotiations, and the ordinance vacating the streets and all papers concerning the transaction.

The Council also passed the new building code, which has been in course of preparation by a special joint committee of Councilmen and architects for months.

During the session of the Council, Mayor Simon, Councilman Annand and City Engineer Morris participated in an unusual incident concerning the bill which vacates Broadway streets.

The remonstrators declared that the pavement is soft in places, and Mr. Annand proceeded to state that this is an indication of unusually good materials and proper workmanship.
