

THAT IS WHAT THE LOCAL TRADE IS LOOKING FOR.

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MARKET IN A POOR WAY

Tanners Have Ceased Buying and Dealers Are Holding Off Purchasers Until Conditions Are More Settled.

The hide market at the present time is in poorer shape than it has been for years. There is no demand for hides and no market at all.

Local prices of salted hides have been cut this week to 7 1/2 cents and it is the belief of some of the dealers that they will drop until it strikes the 6-cent level.

Two years ago, when prices slid off much as they have done lately, the market did not show the depression which now prevails today.

The inactivity of the tanners is responsible for the slump in the hide market. The tanners are staying out entirely, or offering prices so low that they cannot be accepted.

STAMPEDE AT THE CLOSE BOOSTS WHEAT PRICES.

Buying Based on a False Rumor of Export Sales of Wheat at Winnipeg.

CHICAGO, July 6.—In a stampede at the close today, short sellers on the wheat market, who had been excited by an unfounded rumor that sales of wheat for export had been made at Winnipeg, bid up prices.

A remarkable decrease in the world's available supply of wheat upset the confidence of the wheat market.

At the end of the day, the market was closed at a loss of 1 1/2 cents.
