FREIGHT ALL HANDLED

M. C. BANFIELD SAYS NONE WAS SUBJECT TO DEMURRAGE.

Business Cleared Up Saturday, Declares Employers' Leader, and Teamsters' Strike Not Felt.

Not a pound of freight consigned to members of the Employers' Association was left subject to demurrage on account of the strike when Saturday's working hours ended, says M. C. Banfield.

Demurrage on car freight cost the association between \$1200 and \$1500 during the entire period of the strike, says Banfield. At no time was the congestion very serious.

"We have not at any time employed as many teams as during normal times, for the reason that we have done more work with three-fourths of them than we formerly did with all of them.

"There are no places now for the striking teamsters, even if they should wish to come back. We have all the men we want and in fact we have let some men go. The draymen are now able to move all the freight that offers and so far, as we are concerned, the strike is over."
