

OFFICERS SOLVE FIELD PROBLEMS

Oregon Troops. Do Hard Marching in American Lake Maneuvers.

MONTANA GUARD RETURNS

General Mans Compliments Men on Their Effective Work—Oregon Boys Stand Campaigning Well. Few Are on Sick List.

COSGROVE, Wash. Aug. 12.—(Staff Correspondence.)—Maneuvers without the use of troops were practiced in the American Lake district this morning.

PROTECTION OF A DEDICATED LEADING THROUGH TO SUPPLY TRAINS AT THE WEST OF AMERICAN LAKE OCCUPIED THE OFFICERS OF THE OREGON REGIMENTS, WHO WERE ACCOMPANIED IN THE FIELD BY TACTICAL EXPERTS OF THE REGULAR SERVICE.

SOLUTIONS OF THE MILITARY PROBLEMS INVOLVED WERE GENERALLY EVOLVED FROM THE DISCUSSIONS AND BY THE ELUCIDATIONS MADE BY THE EXPERTS ALL THE OFFICERS WERE BROUGHT INTO CLOSER TOUCH WITH CERTAIN IMPORTANT PHASES OF FIELD OPERATIONS.

DEMOCRATS HOLD BACK

REPUBLICANS ONLY IN FIELD IN JACKSON COUNTY.

Declarations of Candidacy Filed for County and Legislative Offices.

MEDFORD, Or., Aug. 12.—(Special.)—So far politics have been quiet in Jackson County, but few candidates announcing themselves for the various offices.

Today John Bellinger filed his declaration as a candidate for the Republican nomination for Sheriff and Fred Colvig for the Republican nomination for County Recorder.

For Senator, Judge William Colvig, president of the Commercial Club, and William von der Hellen, of Wellen, are being urged to come out for the Republican nomination to succeed Senator Mull.

Fred W. Mears, a young lawyer, has filed his declaration for the Republican nomination for Representative. There are two Representatives to be elected, the present incumbents being Democrats, and so far there has been no one willing to announce himself as the candidate for the other place.
