

GOOD SOIL MAKES LAND SAFE HEAVY

General Marshall Says Oregon Doesn't Require Much Irrigation.

ARMY ENGINEERS ARE HERE

Cello Falls and Umatilla Projects to be Inspected—Report Will Determine Federal Expenditure in State.

There is so much good land in Oregon that does not need irrigation that the Government sales have been heavy. Many think that Oregon has contributed much in land sales a large appropriation should be made for this state out of the appropriation of \$25,000,000 by Congress for irrigation. There are sections of country, like Arizona, where nobody will buy land because it is nothing but desert and irrigation is absolutely necessary to make it valuable. The reason there have been large land sales in Oregon and other places is because irrigation is not absolutely necessary. Where land sales cannot be made irrigation is necessary to make the land productive. The question is, shall the fact feed the land?

Oregon Has Good Land.

Where land sales have been heavy the fact is apparent that it can be cultivated without irrigation. No more land is for sale in Oklahoma because it has all been bought up and Oklahoma wants a big sum for irrigation because it has contributed so much money to the Government. Oregon has a lot of good land that will produce crops without irrigation, and that is why land sales in this state have been heavy. Then, there is a question about the amount of water used in each district. Two much water can be used as well as not enough. It is a big question, and I do not know how it will be settled until the report of the engineers is made. I will not know then, for the matter is in the hands of the President.

Major W. W. Harts, another member of the board, who reached the city Sunday, spent yesterday at the Dalles, looking over the canal. The Government is building around Cello Falls. Major Harts was stationed in Portland about ten days ago, occupying the position now held by Major McIndoes, and started the work on the locks.

Dr. F. H. Dammasch, Assistant City Physician, Declares Disease Is Not Spreading Enough to Be Menace in This City.

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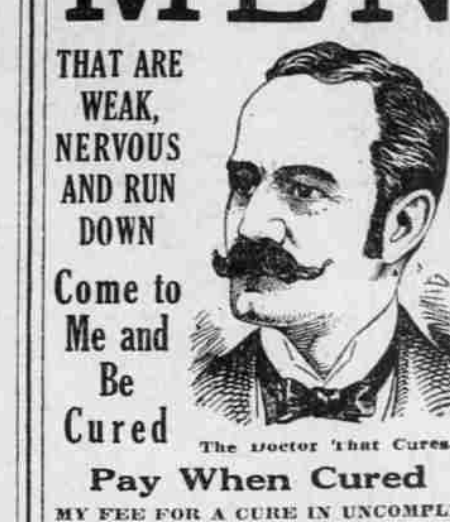
