

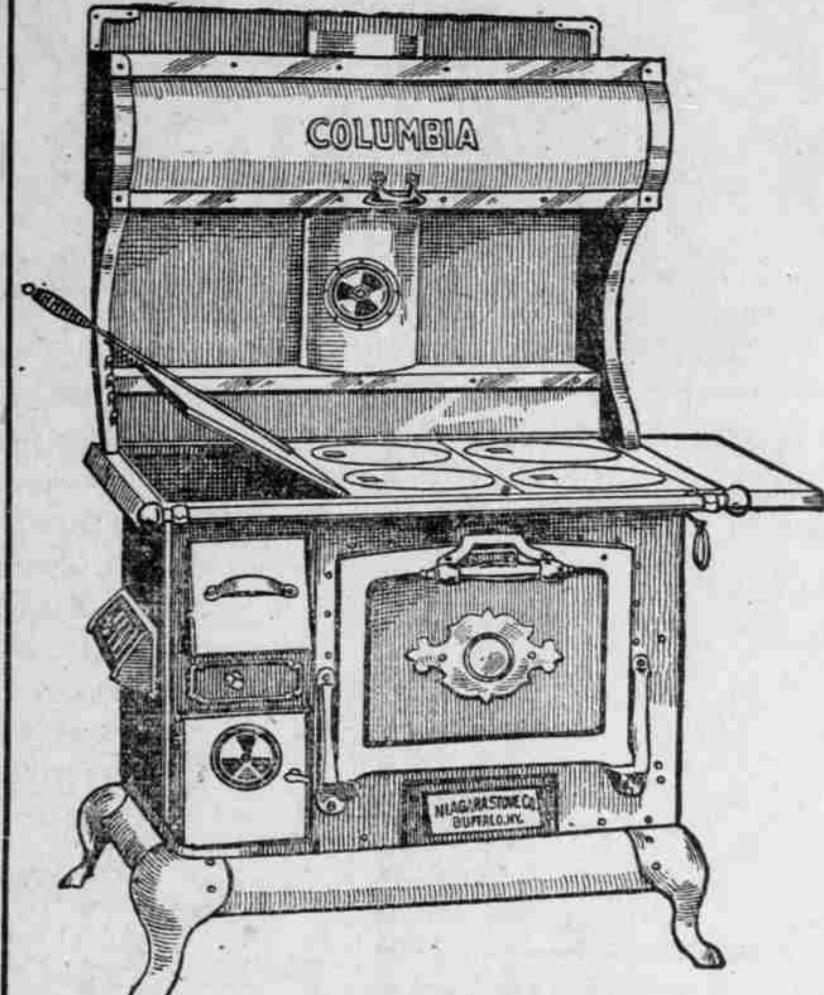

MATE IDENTIFIES CORPSE
Man Killed by Train Was Sailor on Schooner Andromeda.

The mutilated body of the man found dead in the Northern Pacific terminal yards at midnight Friday, was identified at the morgue Saturday night as that of William Delaney, a sailor 40 years old, a member of the crew of the

schooner Andromeda, now moored in the north harbor.

The identification was made through W. C. Thompson, mate aboard the vessel. The body will be buried by the ship's crew.

A mystery surrounds the manner in which Delaney fell beneath the train and was ground to pieces. The mangled form was discovered by Roy Reed, a switch tender, who stumbled upon it while making his rounds in the railroad yards. It is believed Delaney, who was known to have been drinking

heavily since his vessel reached this port several days ago, was struck by an outbound passenger train while walking along the tracks.

He went ashore from the Andromeda at 6:45 o'clock Friday morning, and later in the day was seen in a North End saloon intoxicated.

Delaney joined the crew of the vessel in New York City, November 18, 1909. His parents are thought to reside in New Zealand and he is said to have a cousin, who is affiliated with

the directorate of the First National Bank of San Francisco.

DEPUTIES TO EYE HUNTERS
Effort Will Be Made to Capture Those Who Shatter Insulators.

Hunters and others who delight to shatter the earthen insulators on electric poles beside the suburban elec-

tric line between the city and Gresham are to be arrested by the officials of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Co.

In an effort to curb the practice, Special Operative Lillis will send out a squad of deputies today with instructions to arrest offenders caught shooting at the tempting targets. Warrants will be issued for two hunters who are known to have destroyed several of the insulators last week.
