To John R. Cleland, Superior Judge of Portland, \$3000, because I have great admiration for him as an honest and upright judge.

MIKADO'S DEATH PLOTTED

Conspirators to Be Tried in Secret and Executed, It Report.

TOKYO, Sept. 21.—A sensation was created by the publication this afternoon of the alleged details of a plot among his own subjects to assassinate Emperor Meiji.

The startling story appeared in the Hoch Shimbun, which states that the plotters, who are now under arrest, will be sentenced to death after trials before a special secret court.

This is the first time in the history of the country that the life of the sovereign has been plotted against by his own people.

It is understood that a rigorous censorship had prevented the publication of so much as a hint of the conspiracy until this evening, when the Hoch Shimbun assumed responsibility for the alarming announcement.

The paper's assertions are not without a show of authority. There are now in jail in this city a number of persons alleged to be active in the "alleged socialist" movement, and it is who may be considered to be responsible, state, as does the Hoch Shimbun, that the arrests followed the discovery of a conspiracy against the throne.

According to the paper, the assassins planned to accomplish their end while the Emperor was visiting the military school outside the capital. The plot was discovered in time to protect his majesty and the plotters were seized.

CHINESE GAMBLERS NIPPED

Chee How's Den on Fourth Street Is Raided by Police.

Gambling, which has been practiced on a promiscuous scale in Chinatown for the past several months without interference of the police, received a telling blow last night, when Patrolmen Martine and Johnson swooped down upon the gambling den conducted by Chee How, a Chinese merchant, at 44 North Fourth street, placing him and four of his countrymen and a brace of Japanese under arrest and carted the prisoners, with a quantity of gambling paraphernalia and \$200 in bets to the station.

All were charged with technical offenses and were admitted to bail aggregating \$750, which was advanced by Chee How. The gamblers will be arraigned in court today.

Chee How strenuously protested against his arrest and the action of the arresting officers last night. Despite his threats and declarations that he would seek redress from the higher police authorities Patrolmen Martine and Johnson landed the boastful Chinaman in jail.

For the past several weeks Chee How's den has been under the surveillance of the officers.

CHANLER'S EX-WIFE SUES CAVALIER

Pre-Nuptial Agreement to Be Tested in Fear Her Own Allowance Will Be Impaired.

TRIO MADE DEFENDANTS

Julia Chamberlain Chanler, Who Divorced Her New Husband, Questions Validity of 'Deal.' Receiver Is Asked.

NEW YORK, Sept. 21.—The validity of the famous pre-nuptial agreement between Robert Winthrop Chanler and Lina Cavalieri, his bride, is now certain to be tested in the courts.

Chanler's first wife, Julia Chamberlain Chanler, who obtained a divorce from him in the French courts in 1907, filed suit here today in behalf of herself and her children in an endeavor to set aside the agreement on the ground that it was obtained by fraud and undue influence and that it was not the free act of Robert Winthrop Chanler.

Previous Agreement May Bind. Mrs. Chanler, the first, has an agreement of her own with her ex-husband providing for the payment of \$10,000 yearly for her support and \$5000 yearly for the support of each of her daughters.

"The plaintiff is not aware," she says in her papers, "of the yearly income of the said Robert Chanler, but the plaintiff believes that by the aforesaid agreement the defendant has put it out of his power to carry out the terms of his said agreement with the plaintiff, and that by reason thereof, the plaintiff and her children may be deprived of the means of livelihood."

She continues "that she is further informed and believes that the defendant, at the time of the execution of the said indenture, was in a suggestive mental state that he was susceptible or liable to be easily influenced and deceived and that the defendant, Natalina Cavalieri Chanler, knowing of his condition and taking advantage thereof, contrived, by misrepresentation, specious inducements and undue influence to persuade him to execute the said indenture."

Cancellation Is Asked. "Wherefore, the plaintiffs pray that the agreement be adjudged in fraud of the rights of the plaintiff and the children of the defendant and therefore void, and that it be brought into court to be cancelled and that the record thereof in the office of the Register of the County of New York be cancelled."

The complaint also states that Chanler is in receipt of the income from three separate trust funds and continues its demand that "Natalina Cavalieri be enjoined, pending the action, from disposing of said property and that a receiver be appointed to hold and preserve said property and to receive the income to which the defendant R. W. Chanler may be entitled during the pendency of this action and to pay thereout to this plaintiff, the sums to which she is entitled as aforesaid."

MINNESOTA LAW HELD INVALID IN SUIT TO ENJOIN ENFORCEMENT.

ST. PAUL, Sept. 21.—Filing his findings in the Minnesota commodity freight and 2-cent passenger-rate case today in the United States Circuit Court, Special Master in Chancery Charles E. Otis held those rates to be unconstitutional and confiscatory.

This finding, Judge Otis, unless overruled, wipes out the rate-making power of the State of Minnesota through the Warehouse and Railroad Commission and has a somewhat general effect in establishing a Federal rate supervision as against state rate supervision.

The finding in the three cases was the result of suits brought some two years ago by certain stockholders of the Northern Pacific, Great Northern and Missouri & St. Louis Railways against their respective companies, the Attorney-General of Minnesota, the State Warehouse and Railroad Commission and certain shippers to enjoin them from enforcing certain freight rates prescribed by state authority and the statutory 2 cents per mile passenger fare.

HAY COMPLIMENTS FAIR

GOVERNOR'S DAY ATTRACTS LARGE CROWD AT CHEHALIS. Grandstand Is Taxed to Capacity and 8000 Persons Are Counted on Grounds.

CHEHALIS, Wash., Sept. 21.—(Special.)—Today was Governor's day and Chehalis-Centralia day at the South-west Washington State Fair, and the crowd was a splendid turnout from the two cities.

Many other southwest cities were represented, attendance being heavy from Olympia and the Grays Harbor country. The crowd was estimated at about 8000, and the entertainment furnished was of the highest class.
