### CHOLERA GRIPS NAPLES

PLAGUE STALKING STREETS, STRIKES DOWN PEOPLE.  
 Poorer Classes Dying of Disease and Inhabitants Flee City in Panic.  
 Soldiers on Guard.  
 ROME, Sept. 27.—With the removal of the censorship, startling details of the cholera epidemic at Naples are being received. A number of persons have died in the streets, and the popular excitement is such that the police have great difficulty in maintaining order. It is reported that 100,000 persons of the wealthier classes already have fled from Naples.  
 There were 31 new cases and 26 deaths from the cholera in Naples yesterday.  
 Immigrants arriving today from America were forcibly prevented from landing. The passengers on the steamer Canopic, which reached Naples yesterday from Boston, were permitted to disembark, but were immediately escorted to the railroad station by soldiers.  
 Most of the cases are in the squalid quarter of the city. The Duke and Duchess of Aosta have hurriedly returned to Naples and are organizing relief methods.  
 Professor Doria, president of the board of health, announced yesterday that there have been four cases of Asiatic cholera in Rome. One of these proved fatal, while the others are recovering. The origin of all have been traced to Naples.  
 In the last 24 hours, four new cases and three deaths have been reported in the southeastern district.  
 At a Cabinet meeting yesterday the ministers deliberated on measures necessitated by the prevalence of cholera at Naples. Special consideration was given to the questions of shipping and emigration.  
 Detachments of police and 150 carabinieri have been sent to Naples to assist in the enforcement of sanitary measures.  
 Settlers Flock to Lane County.  
 LAKEVIEW, Or., Sept. 27.—(Special.)—Hundreds of settlers are coming into Lane County to take the many thousands of acres of Government land in Goldie, Edith and Christmas Lake valleys, where the survey of the Oregon Eastern Railway traverses the eastern portion of the state.

### SEVENTH SPOUSE BALKS

VANCOUVER MAN SAYS WIFE IS ABUSIVE; WANTS DIVORCE.  
 Dissatisfied Husband Says He Was Seventh Man—Woman Alleged to Have Threatened His Life.  
 VANCOUVER, Wash., Sept. 27.—(Special.)—Married seven times, Mrs. Agnes Brown, of this county, is threatened with losing her husband, John Brown. In a divorce suit filed today by John Brown, in the Superior Court, it is stated that Mrs. Brown has borne the names of Mrs. Agnes Brown, Mrs. Agnes Tibbott, Mrs. Agnes Peterson, Mrs. Agnes Miller, Mrs. Agnes Hewitt, Mrs. Agnes Sharkey, and Mrs. Agnes Roubait.  
 Mr. and Mrs. Brown were married in Oregon City, Or., October 11, 1905, and have since lived together. According to Brown's story, during the past two years Mrs. Brown has made life a burden for him, by her ungovernable temper and her fiery tongue. Besides swearing at him and using abusive language, he says she actually drove him from his own home and threatened his life.  
 When the couple married the woman had two lots in Vancouver worth about \$500 each. A home was built on one of the lots. During their married life, Brown says he gave his wife every penny of his earnings, part of which she used to improve their property. The home was improved to the extent of \$1500, and is now worth \$350. Brown asks absolute divorce, property worth \$3000, and \$350 attorney's fees and such other relief as may seem just.
