

CHOLERA SCARE REACHES GOTHAM

Steamers Are Delayed at Quarantine Pending Investigation.

PASSENGER DIES AT SEA

Health Officer for Port of New York Says Vessels Having on Board Suspicious Cases Must Keep Off Shore.

NEW YORK, Oct. 4.—The steamship Sant Anna, from French and Italian ports, now detained at quarantine, had a case of cholera aboard.

Announcement of the foregoing was made tonight by Dr. A. H. Doty, health officer of the port.

Dr. Doty's statement discloses not only that a cholera patient died aboard the Sant Anna, but that a steamer passenger, a "suspicious case" removed from the steamer Germania on September 25, subsequently died.

MEN FALL FROM ROOF

THRILLING RESCUE MADE FROM SEATTLE BUILDING.

Other Man Falls to Sidewalk and Dies—Survivor's Grip on Projection Almost Fails.

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 4.—(Special.)—In full view of many pedestrians, who were passing on the opposite side of the street, J. A. Campbell, 30 years old, and David Swanson, 23 years old, employees of the Sound Roofing & cornice works, 2116 First avenue, plunged from the roof of the four-story Jackson Hotel, 608 Jackson street, when a scaffold on which they were working gave way, shortly after 8 o'clock this afternoon.

Campbell struck the sidewalk, receiving injuries from which he died an hour later at the City Hospital. Swanson, in his downward plunge, grasped a projection above the window of the second story.

Finally half a dozen at the top of the building rushed to the second story, found the room before which he dangled, opened the window and drew him from his precarious position.
