LANE RESIDENTS HERE

OPPOSITION TO COUNTY DIVISION IS KEEN.
Delegation Anxious to Sound Sentiment of Portland and Protest Against Changes.

A delegation of leading business men of Lane County arrived in Portland yesterday and additional committee-men will come in today and Monday for the purpose of quietly sounding sentiment in the metropolis upon county division. Among those in the city, and including others to arrive this morning, are: J. M. Shalloo, George Gross, W. A. Bell, C. S. Williams, George D. O'Connor, J. W. Hobbs and Manager Freeman, of the Eugene Commercial Club.

A bitter fight is on in the southern part of the Willamette Valley against the proposed creation of NeSmith County which Cottage Grove county seceded out of the heart of Lane and Douglas Counties. If left to the people of Cottage Grove, Lane and Douglas Counties it is said the sentiment is in favor of NeSmith would overwhelmingly fall. Should NeSmith and Williams Counties be achieved a confusing situation, terminating in voluminous litigation, would undoubtedly result as the proposed boundary lines overlap one another.
