

HUGGS OFF A QUARTER

Other Lines of Livestock Hold Steady.

ACTIVE DAY AT YARDS

Shipment of Cattle Is Received From Wyoming - Heavy - Weight Steers Sell at Good Prices.

The week has opened with the hog market fully a quarter lower than last week, owing to the steady supply that has been coming in and the holding back by buyers.

An interesting feature of the cattle market was the sale of a few very heavy steers. One weighing 2225 pounds brought \$1.50 and two averaging 2000 pounds sold at \$1. The best steers on sale found buyers at \$1.55. Cows ranged from \$1.75 to \$1.50 and calves went at \$1.75. The first large shipment of Wyoming cattle this fall was received at the yards yesterday.

Two good-sized bunches of lambs brought \$1.75 and a load of mixed and Monday were \$1.75. Receipts for Monday and Tuesday were 8000 cattle, 160 hogs and 2 horses.
