

HOME RULE ASSOCIATION PRESENTED

Home Rule Association Only Recommends, in Deference to Council.

SALIENT POINTS COVERED

Recommendations Made to City's Legislators Include All Regulations of Liquor Traffic Urged by Organization.

Instead of presenting a model liquor license ordinance which was prepared by attorneys for the Greater Oregon Home Rule Association as a measure to regulate the saloon and the liquor traffic in Portland, a list of recommendations, covering in a general way the provisions of the ordinance, was presented to the City Council for consideration.

The model liquor license ordinance was prepared after considerable deliberation and embodied a modification of the liquor license ordinance now in existence. While the measure was being prepared, it became known to the advisory board of the Greater Oregon Home Rule Association that members of the Council represented the action of the association in presenting an ordinance to regulate saloons in Portland, which would be drafted and presented to the City Council.

Recommendations Are Made.

Following are the recommendations:

First—To prohibit absolutely the sale of intoxicating beverages in saloons, and to prohibit saloons from being located in places where such beverages are sold.

To carry out the above provisions we suggest that in addition to the present ordinance, the following regulations be adopted:

Second—To prohibit the sale of intoxicating beverages to habitual drunkards and to persons who are incapable of taking care of themselves.

To carry this into effect and in addition to the ordinance at present in force in this city, we would suggest that the following regulations be adopted:

Third—To prohibit women from visiting saloons for the purpose of purchasing intoxicating beverages, except where such beverages are sold with food and means in a restaurant or cafe.

The present ordinance, if enforced, seems to us to cover fully this provision.

Fourth—To prohibit saloons from being located in places where such beverages are sold.

To carry this into effect and in addition to the ordinance at present in force in this city, we would suggest that the following regulations be adopted:

Fifth—To prescribe reasonable hours for the opening and closing of saloons in all such licensed places.

In respect to this and in view of the consideration of the present ordinance, we suggest that the following regulations be adopted:

Sunday Closing Indorsed.

Sixth—To prohibit all licensed places from opening or keeping open or selling intoxicating beverages on Sunday.

We suggest that the present ordinance be amended so that it shall apply to all saloons from 12 o'clock Saturday night until 5 o'clock A. M. Monday morning.

Seventh—To prohibit saloons from being located in places where such beverages are sold.
