## SURPRISES ARE PROMISED

Prosecution Seeks to Prove That Burke Not Only Placed Dynamite, but Treated Wounds With Poison Afterward.

BANTA ROSA, Cal., Dec. 8 - (Special.)-Lou Etta Smith, smartly gowned in a ell-fitting bive tailored suit and looking many years younger then she did at the time her tenthouse at Burke's sanitarium was dynamited, took the stand in the Eurhe case this afternoon. Her ap-pearance on the stand was a surprise, but it is intimated by the District Attorney that it is only one of the surprises that are to be developed at the trial. In the course of her examination many letters written by Dr. Burks to Lou Etta were admitted over the objections of At-formers Leppo and Cowan, of the de-ficies.

The letters show the tender relations that existed between the venerable proprietor of the health resort and the woman whose tenthouse was dynamited. It was also shown by the letters that Dr. Burke had furnished the woman with money, sent her in the form of checks, when she was residing in Berkeley and in San Francisco, and had also furnished her money with which to support herself.
