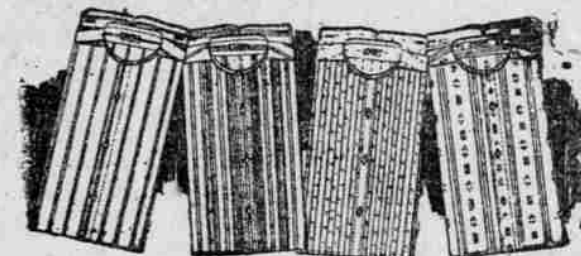

CHICAGO GETS COAST SHOW

Lumbermen to Place Exhibit in East to Cost \$3000.

TACOMA, Wash., Dec. 28.—(Special.)—The Pacific Coast Lumber Manufacturers Association at its monthly meeting at the Commercial Club, authorized the installation at Chicago of a fir lumber exhibit similar to that which has proved successful in Minneapolis the past few years. The greater part of \$3000 necessary to equip and install the exhibit was subscribed on the spot.

The Minneapolis exhibit will also be continued.

The Association legislative committee was instructed to take up with the next Legislature the problem presented by a state law which does not permit the "average depuration" rule of the railroads to apply to intra-state business. G. G. Startup and Edward F. Schaffer were appointed delegates to meetings of Eastern Retail Lumbermen at Omaha, Kansas City and Minneapolis. Another committee will be appointed to meet the Oregon and Washington Association at Centralia soon to plan a joint advertising campaign for fir.

OLD BAKER MINE PRODUCES

Connor Creek Property Shows Recent Strike of Ore.

BAKER, Or., Dec. 28.—(Special.)—The old Connor Creek mine on Snake River began operation again today by starting ten stamps upon the rich ore recently uncovered. According to F. J. Powers, in charge of the mine, the bullion strike was made about two weeks ago and arrangements were immediately made to renew operations of the mine. The strike is one of the richest made

for years. The mine is the oldest in Baker County and has been worked for over 40 years. It is estimated that over \$2,000,000 worth of gold has been taken from the property.

Railroad Man Goes on School Board

MARSHFIELD, Or., Dec. 28.—(Special.)—C. J. Mills, general manager for the local interests of the Southern Pacific Railroad, has been elected member of the Marshfield School Board to take the place of W. S. McFarland, who has moved from the city. Another school election will be held the latter part of this month when the levy for school taxes will be settled.

CHRISTMAS TURKEY FATAL

Cold-storage Fowl Causes Ptomaine Poisoning, Is Belief.

Suffering from ptomaine poisoning due, it is said, to eating cold-storage turkey at Christmas dinner, George Gould, 8 years old, son of Mrs. H. L. Gould, died at the home of his mother, 618 Clay street yesterday afternoon. The boy showed no ill effects from his holiday meal until Tuesday night when he was attacked by severe pains, and although prompt medical attendance was obtained for him he did not

improve, death resulting yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock. While the lad also ate candy Christmas day this is not blamed for his death as other children, who also ate the confection, have suffered no ill effects.

Grants Pass Club Out for Members.

GRANTS PASS, Or., Dec. 28.—(Special.)—The Grants Pass Commercial Club is making rapid strides to increase the membership to 500 before the first of the year. At the last rally for new members over 80 joined in one night. Since that time arrivals from the East have settled in the Valley and all are

willing to join upon an invitation. Many of the largest fruitgrowers in the county have recently joined and attend the meetings in automobiles.

Brush Prairie Millman Bankrupt.

BRUSH PRAIRIE, Wash., Dec. 28.—(Special.)—William McKenzie, who operated a sawmill near Brush Prairie last summer and who was followed into the city last year by irate workmen who wanted their pay, was today declared a bankrupt. To George B. Simpson, referee in bankruptcy, he said he had liabilities of \$4000 and assets of \$9000. January 8 was set for hearing the case.
