Extensive operations are being started in lode mining of gold and copper and the future production is expected to be greater than that which followed the development of the placers.
Since mining began in 1880 Alaska has produced minerals worth \$180,000,000 of which \$119,000,000 was gold. The Juneau district is expected to produce heavily when new plants are installed. There are new 13 gold lodes operated in Alaska.

Canadian-American Traffic to Be Under Control.

TERMS ARE NEGOTIATED

International Commission Is Plan Which Knapp and Mabie Propose to Regulate Commerce Which Crosses the Boundary.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20.-An international railway commission with super-visory authority over railroads operating between the United States and Canada

practically is assured.

After long negotiations between the United States and Canada, a conclusion was reached that, in the course of a few months, regulatory authority would be extended over reliway operations between the two countries.

Martin A. Knapp, chairman of the Interstate Commerce Commission, and J. H. Mable, chief of the railway commis-ation of Canada, have been in conference for several days and reported an agree-ment last Wednesday. They called at the Department of State today and presented their joint report. The text thereof is

not available.

It is known, however, that they have agreed on an international railway commission which shall have supervisory authority over railway lines doing an international business between the two countries. This is to extend to the regulation of freight and passenger rates and also to through routes and joint rates and through bills of lading from points in one country to points in the other.

The commission may be appealed to by shippers or carriers in either country for relief from what they deem oppressive methods or excessive rates.

COUGHLIN DIES IN EXILE

One of Cronin's Accused Murderers Passes in Honduras.

CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—A special from New Orleans to the Record-Herald says:
"Dan Coughlin, who was one of the principal figures in the famous Dr. Cronin murder mystery and who was wanted in Chicago on a charge of jury-bribing, is dead in San Pedro, Honduras."

Two decades ago "Dan" Coughlin was one of the central figures in the noted Cronin case at Chicago. Dr. Cronin was murdered and his body thrown into a sewer. Coughlin was arrested, charged with complicity in the crime, but was freed by the Illinois Supreme Court.

Several years later he was indicted on a charge of bribery in a railroad damage suit. Coughlin fied to Honduras, but after a few years in exile returned to Mobile, Ala., where he was arrested. He escaped through legal technicalities and returned to Honduras.
