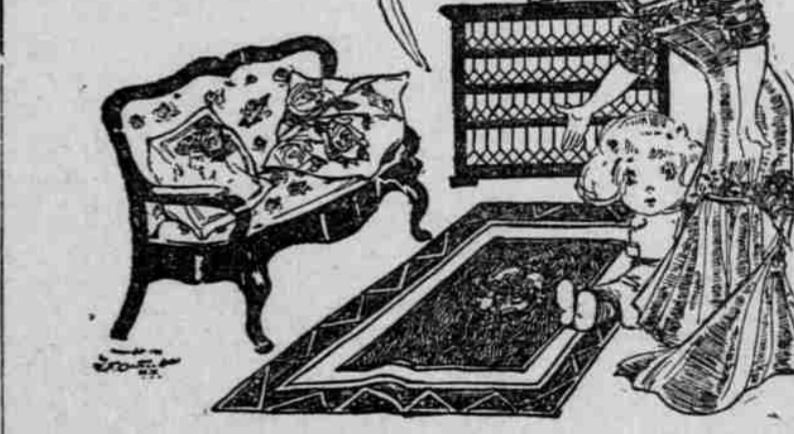
UTAH REPUBLICANS FOR SUTHERLAND.
