As he left the executive offices he said he would not oppose consideration of the measure and that, if it were defeated, it he said, he was opposed to the bill and would vote against it.

RELIEF FUND INSUFFICIENT

Beneficiary Not Barred from Suing Railroad for Damages.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20 .- The constitutionalty of the law of Iowa passed in 1898, enabling an employe of the operating department of a railroad to sue a railroad for injuries, notwithstanding would be by Republicans.
