It was yesterday reported that the
schooner schooner Condon had sailed

week to load general cargo.

more important needs of the society is
the purchase of horses for the new ambulance
provided by the society.

The entire proceeds of the entertainment
will be given to the society to carry
on its work in this city. Samuel Kramer
has provided a band, hand cards
printed and has donated his riding ring
for the occasion. Members of the Portland
Hunt Club have been devoting a great
deal of time to practice and even
children are interested in the cause.

In the exhibitions listed are the pretty
riding evolutions by the children's
riding classes. This will include a pretty
quadrille by the Portland Hunt Club
riders who also stage some drills, similar to those shown
at the Society Circus last year. Among
other entertainment features will be the
high jumping, racing and polo games
for a cup donated by Studebaker Brothers
Company. The performance will begin
at 8 o'clock.

GRANTS PASS, Or., Feb. 28.—(Special)—
An idea of the magnitude of diversified
farming in Rogue River Valley may
be found at the Penn-Oregon Ranch,
eight miles west of this city, where the
Applegate River flows into Rogue River.

The managers are now employing
12 men and nine teams during the Spring
season. One hundred acres will be sown
with alfalfa, 200 acres in grain, and 300
acres will be devoted to potatoes, cabbage,
pumpkins and several different
